On Friday, March 20th, canned and non-perishable foods were delivered to the Union Presbyterian Church in the Town of Newburgh to help community members in need. The church's food pantry provides food to community members in need.

Since 2024, the Town of Newburgh Town Clerk Lisa Vance-Ayers and her staff have spearheaded the collection of donated canned and non-perishable foods at the Town of Newburgh Town Hall as well as the delivery of these non-perishable foods to the Union Presbyterian Church, located at 44 Old Balmville Road in the Town.

During February 2026, which is National Canned Food Month, the Town Clerk's Office partnered with Senator Rob Rolison's Office for the first time on this important endeavor to meet the community's needs. Canned and non-perishable foods were collected at the Town of Newburgh Town Hall and subsequently delivered to the Union Presbyterian Church.
