In accordance with Supervisor Piaquadio's request, enclosed please find for the Town Board's consideration the above referenced draft Resolution regarding the waiver for this year of the requirement for seniors and the disabled to file renewal applications for the partial tax exemptions which the Town affords qualified property owners who meet the income limitations. The referenced emergency Executive Order issued by Governor Hockul allows assessing units to adopt such resolutions for the 2022 assessment rolls and is substantially the same as the one issued by the previous Governor for the 2021 assessment rolls. The deadline for filing the applications is generally March 1. Assessor Molly Carhart has requested that the Board consider adopting the resolution.

RESOLUTION TO WAIVE THE RENEWAL APPLICATION REQUIREMENT FOR THE 2022 ASSESSMENT ROLL FOR SENIOR CITIZENS AND THE DISABLED WITH LIMITED INCOME PURSUANT TO EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 11.1

Councilman/woman _____ presented the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman/woman _____.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh has heretofore enacted local laws granting partial tax exemptions on real property owned by senior citizens and the disabled who meet the statutory qualifications and income limitations pursuant to Real Property Tax Law Sections 467 and 459-c; and

WHEREAS, the Hon Kathleen C. Hochul, Governor of the State of New York, has issued emergency Executive Order 11.1 allowing the governing bodies of assessment units to adopt a resolution directing the assessor to grant exemptions on the 2022 assessment roll to all property owners who received the exemption of the 2021 assessment roll, dispensing with the need for renewal applications from such persons, provided that the assessor may be granted authority to require a renewal application when he or she has reason to believe that an owner who qualified for the exemption on the 2021 assessment roll may have since changed primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred ownership or died pursuant to procedures included in the resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Newburgh Town Board, in its capacity as governing body of the Town of Newburgh, does hereby direct the Assessor of the Town of Newburgh to grant exemptions pursuant to Section 467 and 459-c on the 2022 assessment roll to all property owners who received that exemption on the 2021 assessment roll, provided however, that the assessor may forward by mail and require the submission by mail or in person of a renewal application to be filed when she has reason to believe that an owner who qualified for the exemption on the 2021 assessment roll may have since changed his or her primary residence, added another owner to the deed, transferred the property to a new owner, or died within the timeframes specified by statute or local law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforesaid resolution shall take effect immediately and shall apply retroactively to any person who failed to file a renewal application.
