I'd like to welcome you to the Town of Newburgh Planning Board meeting 4 5 of July 5th. At this time we'll call the meeting 6 to order with a roll call vote starting with 7 Frank Galli 8 9 MR. GALLI: Present. 10 MR. MENNERICH: Present. 11 MR. FOGARTY: Here. 12 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Present. The Planning Board has consultants 13 14 and professionals that make recommendations to the Planning Board. I ask that they introduce 15 themselves at this time. 16 MR. DONNELLY: Michael Donnelly, 17 18 Planning Board Attorney. 19 MS. CONERO: Michelle Conero, 20 Stenographer. 21 MR. CANFIELD: Jerry Canfield, Town of 22 Newburgh, Code Compliance. 23 MR. HINES: Pat Hines with McGoey, 24 Hauser & Edsall Consulting Engineers. 25 MR. COCKS: Bryant Cocks, Planning

3	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: At this point I'd	
4	like to turn the meeting over to Tom Fogarty.	
5	MR. FOGARTY: Would everyone please	
6	rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.	
7	(Pledge of Allegiance.)	
8	MR. FOGARTY: Would everyone please	
9	turn off their cell phones.	
10	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: The one item we	
11	have on this evening's agenda is New York City	
12	DEP Delaware Aqueduct Repair. It's a site plan	
13	and it's being represented by the New York City	
14	DEP. Their point person this evening is Chris	
15	Villari.	
16	MR. VILLARI: Yes.	
17	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Please.	
18	MR. VILLARI: Thank you very much. As	3
19	the Chair said, I am Chris Villari, the Outreach	1
20	Lead for Water for the Future, the program to	
21	repair the Delaware Aqueduct.	
22	Normally I have a roll call sheet for	
23	everyone. Unfortunately today I forgot it.	
24	Instead I'll just read them directly into the	
25	record. Phil Simmons, Todd West, Mark Page and	

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 4 Jennifer Farmwald, all from DEP. 2 So what I'd like to let you know, and 3 as you probably already are aware, the 4 5 commissioner very recently signed the Findings Statement, so as lead agency that concluded the 6 7 EIS process. We have also provided the Planning 8 9 Board's Attorney with a draft -- well, a PDF of 10 the signed version and then a Word document 11 version so that he could craft the Findings 12 Statement on behalf of the Planning Board. 13 As always, we came prepared to go 14 through the different stages and present in more 15 formal pattern, although if you're okay with that 16 we can forgo that and ask if you have any further 17 comments on the site plan? CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: How would you like 18 19 t.o --20 MR. GALLI: Any way you want to manage 21 it. 22 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Any final comments 23 on the site plan? 24 MR. GALLI: No. 25 MR. MENNERICH: I'm just curious. The

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 2 Findings Statement, Mike has a copy of that? MR. DONNELLY: Yes. 3 4 MR. MENNERICH: Okay. 5 MR. DONNELLY: You've seen it as well; right? 6 7 MR. MENNERICH: Yeah. Yeah. When he mentioned that you would be developing the 8 9 Findings for the Planning Board, that's the 10 resolution? 11 MR. DONNELLY: No. Well, under SEQRA 12 the lead agency must issue a Findings Statement. Other involved agencies, agencies that have 13 14 permit approval authority over the project, may 15 issue their own findings if they feel it's warranted. We had discussed whether or not we 16 would need to do that, and the applicant has 17 delivered to us, last Thursday I guess it was, a 18 copy of the Findings, and they were good enough 19 20 to give me one in Word format in case we wanted 21 to use it as a template, so to speak, to issue 22 our own. Pat, Ken Wersted, Bryant and myself 23 have all looked at the Findings that the DEC 24 issued, and our recommendation to you is you need not issue your own, that they're adequate. 25

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 2 Between the built-in mitigation measures, the existence of the discussion to develop a 3 memorandum of understanding or letter agreement 4 with the Town on the few issues that were not 5 fully resolved within the EIS and the fact that 6 7 we have now crafted a resolution of approval that contains conditions, we're not recommending to 8 9 you that you issue your own independent Findings 10 and rely on the Findings issued by the DEP 11 itself. 12 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Tom Fogarty? MR. FOGARTY: I have no further 13 14 questions. 15 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay. Do you want 16 to begin discussing the resolution? 17 MR. DONNELLY: Sure. I can go through the draft resolution. The DEP team has had a 18 chance to see it in its various drafts, were good 19 20 enough to fix my typos, to correct the name of 21 their agency. I knew it was the Department of 22 Environmental Protection, I just got crazy. 23 I'll just go through the pages. I'm 24 not going to recite it from the beginning. On 25 page 2 where you see property involved, I've been

2 given a copy of all of the tax map numbers and I
3 will insert those in that section under the
4 heading property involved.

5 The guts of the resolution begin on page 12 when it comes to the individual 6 7 conditions. Condition number 1 was simply a placeholder in case we came up with something 8 9 tonight. If we do not, and I'm not anticipating 10 that we will, everything will renumber with 11 condition number 2 beginning as condition number 12 1.

We say in the first section on page 12 13 14 all of the mitigation measures within the EIS and 15 the SEQRA Findings are hereby incorporated into 16 this resolution as conditions as if they were set 17 forth herein at length. In order to make sure 18 that those EIS and Findings mitigation measures, particularly those having to do with the well 19 20 monitoring protocol, the blasting protocol, the 21 noise mitigation blend, those are all to be 22 incorporated or entered into an agreement with 23 the Town. That is going through drafts right now and I'm sure that will be finalized in the near 24 future. 25

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NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 8 Additionally, and I think it's a 2 resolved issue but it will be in the agreement, 3 how the New York State Uniform Building Fire and 4 Prevention Code applies here, who is to issue 5 building permits and certificate of occupancies 6 in the main. They will not be issued by the Town 7 but rather by the New York City DEP itself. All 8 of those issues have been discussed with the Town 9 10 Board, with Mark Taylor the Town Attorney, and 11 they are the subject of that agreement. The 12 resolution is simply tying into it. 13 In condition number 4 we say what has 14 also been agreed to, and that is the provisions 15 regarding lighting and illumination on the site 16 will be governed by the Town Code of the Town of 17 Newburgh.

The next page, noise mitigation. There 18 is ongoing discussion with the Town Board as to 19 20 whether the noise mitigation plan will satisfy 21 the terms of the code regarding noise. If it 22 does not, then it is not incorporated into the 23 agreement, then the applicant will need to get a 24 variance from the ZBA from those noise 25 provisions, which although they're not in the

2	zoning code are subject to ZBA appeal.
3	Traffic. We mention again the traffic
4	improvements required on the plans and in the EIS
5	and Findings.
6	Condition number 7 was the subject of
7	our discussion earlier and the discussion with
8	Ken Wersted in a conference call of last week,
9	and you have a letter memo from him before you.
10	You will recall that the EIS made assumptions and
11	projections as to truck traffic coming and
12	leaving the site carrying the materials that
13	would the muck, as we call it, that comes up
14	out of the shaft. It was important to you in the
15	earlier discussions that those assumptions and
16	projections, which are just that because there is
17	not yet a project to which the fill material will
18	be taken, if there was a radical departure, that
19	you wanted to make sure that you would hear
20	further from the New York City DEP. We had a
21	lengthy discussion on the telephone, and when we
22	recognized where the site was, how many cross
23	streets there were to the north and the fairly
24	small number of truck trips that are projected to
25	go to the north, the feeling was that the

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 10 2 appropriate trigger would be a doubling or -- I'm sorry, an increase of more than fifty percent and 3 that there would be no need for further study or 4 5 amended mitigation measures, simply a report to you on that change in truck traffic. If I'm 6 stating it correctly, that's the conclusion and 7 recommendation of Ken Wersted, your Traffic 8 9 Engineer.

10 The following pages list the large 11 number of agency approvals the New York City DEP 12 will need to receive, and some of them may or may 13 not apply. The language makes that clear in case 14 those agencies say there's no need for permit 15 approval.

16 Condition number 9 is a slight 17 rewording of your usual condition that requires 18 that when the applicant pursues their applications to other involved agencies, that 19 20 they copy you on all of their letters of 21 correspondence. Both Chris and the Chairman 22 pointed out to me that we don't really want to 23 see all those hundreds of letters, the ones that 24 do not matter. So the language has been modified 25 to say the relevant correspondence and the

2 approvals themselves. We would make one additional change to the language where it says 3 provide evidence of permit approvals from those 4 agencies to the Planning Board, and we would also 5 6 request that you add and BC Planning, Bryant 7 Cocks, because he is the gatekeeper and it will be important for him to receive those copies and 8 9 keep track of where we are in that approval 10 process.

We talked a little bit about 11 12 landscaping installation and maintenance in 13 conditions 10 and 11 on pages 17 and 18. 14 Starting on page 18 we then have a number of 15 conditions that relate to financial security. As 16 we discussed earlier at the work session, this 17 project, with a governmental applicant, is a little -- there's a very small amount of public 18 improvements. It's in a little different boat 19 20 than a private developer who is building a Town 21 roadway system or sewer and water lines that the 22 Town will eventually take ownership of. In those 23 circumstances it's important that you have 24 performance bonding in place so that if that 25 private developer went belly up and walked off

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NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 12 2 the job, that the Town would have a place to fund to complete the roadway, water lines or sewer 3 lines as the case may be. That does not apply in 4 5 the main here. You have a governmental agency which is not likely to go bankrupt. Obviously 6 7 governmental agencies and municipalities can. But moreover, most of the work to be done is work 8 9 the Town would never undertake to complete itself 10 in any event. What's more important is that 11 there be some agreement reached on restoration in the event the job were to cease for a lengthy 12 13 period of time or to be abandoned by the DEP. 14 That type of bonding I think can better be 15 handled by discussions with the Town Board and incorporation into the agreement. However, as a 16 17 backstop, in the event that agreement is not reached, the Planning Board has to comply with 18 the code. 19

In conditions 14 and so on, we begin our usual language that requires the bonding and inspections fees with a caveat that says unless modified by an agreement entered into with the Town Board, the applicant would have to post the financial security. In general the inspection

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2 fees for the three classes of improvements here, 3 the water mains, stormwater and landscaping, will 4 remain in place. Again, the Town Board has the 5 authority to modify that as well.

And we finish with condition 19 which 6 7 is your standard condition that simply says that the applicant may not build anything on the site 8 of a structural or fixture nature that's not 9 10 shown on the plans without an amended approval. It doesn't mean a whole lot here because the 11 12 applicant, when they're done, is going to leave a concrete slab over the shaft. There really isn't 13 14 anything that will be built, although there 15 certainly will be equipment and trailers and 16 structures on site during the lengthy process of construction. 17

So I think that covers all of the issues. I don't believe your technical consultants have made any recommendations for additional conditions.

There were some language changes that the DEP requested. Those are built into the current draft before you.

25 I think we should ask the DEP whether

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 14 2 there's anything objectionable in what they see. I believe that they're satisfied that they can 3 live with these conditions and they are 4 5 appropriate for what you're proposing. CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Before I introduce 6 7 that concept to DEP, I'll hear from our consultants if there's anything they want to add 8 9 or change. 10 Bryant Cocks, Planning Consultant. 11 MR. COCKS: I have nothing further. We 12 were in contact with both Chris Villari and Mike 13 Donnelly in regards to the Findings Statement and 14 the resolution. So we have nothing further. 15 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Pat Hines, Drainage 16 Consultant? 17 MR. HINES: We have nothing additional and note a lot of the requirements are being 18 handled by the intergovernmental agreement with 19 20 the Town Board that's being worked out. 21 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Jerry Canfield, 22 Code Compliance? 23 MR. CANFIELD: The only issue that I do 24 have, as Pat has mentioned, on page 12 we talk about the items that will be addressed in the 25

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2 intergovernmental agreement. One point of contention between both parties, DEP and the 3 Town, is the application of the New York State 4 5 Uniform Building and Fire Prevention Code. It is 6 understood by both parties that the Town will not 7 issue a building permit, however the governing document, Title 19, that the -- that governs 8 9 building code enforcement specifies that the 10 entity, including the City of New York, will 11 administer or be responsible to administer its 12 own authority over the New York State Building Code. I believe DEP's contention is that they 13 14 wanted to say the City of New York Building Code. 15 So that's just an issue that Mark Taylor, myself 16 and the State is in the process of working out. 17 I don't know if that language should be changed or held off until perhaps we get this worked out. 18

19 MR. DONNELLY: Well these are simply 20 subject matters that are to be included within 21 the agreement, not the terms of what the 22 agreement itself will say. I think it's flagged 23 for that purpose.

24 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Tom Fogarty,25 questions?

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NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 MR. FOGARTY: We had a recent memo from 2 Ken regarding the number of truck trips and so 3 They're estimating twenty-four truck trips 4 on. during the peak hours. What do you determine to 5 be the peak hours? 6 7 MR. PAGE: In the EIS the peak hours, we conservatively assumed they are the commuter 8 9 peaks. However, we basically assumed it would be 10 the twenty-four trips every hour. 11 MR. FOGARTY: Every hour over the 12 twenty-four --MR. VILLARI: Over the construction 13 14 phase that's applicable. 15 MR. HINES: They haven't done actual 16 traffic counts to determine those peaks. They 17 were identified in both the draft and final 18 impact statements. MR. DONNELLY: That's the time of the 19 20 day it matters, even though they may be uniform 21 throughout, because they sit on top of that peak. 22 MR. FOGARTY: Okay. Thank you. 23 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Ken Mennerich? 24 MR. MENNERICH: I have no questions. 25 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Frank Galli?

3	MR. DONNELLY: There was one other
4	change from what's before you, and that's on page
5	22 in the general conditions.
6	Chris, it's consistent with what we
7	spoke of earlier, and that is the two-year
8	provision. It is tied under our code, the
9	issuance of a building permit, which is not going
10	to happen here. We said instead, because we need
11	to be mindful of that section, that the approval
12	will become null and void unless construction
13	authorized by this approval has commenced within
14	that time, which is more appropriate to what
15	we're facing here. That simply means not that
16	you're going to finish the job in the two by
17	the way, it can be extended for an additional
18	year under the code but you have to ask for it.
19	Not that construction has to be completed but
20	that it has to commence. Realistically it has
21	already, the construction authorized by the site
22	plan, which will self satisfy itself in no time.
23	MR. FOGARTY: Has the process started
24	in the selection of a general contractor?
25	MR. VILLARI: Yes.

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 18 2 MR. FOGARTY: It has. Do you know when that will be completed? 3 MR. VILLARI: We're expecting it back 4 5 in late July. 6 MR. FOGARTY: In late July. 7 MR. PAGE: They're not going to get awarded until the end of the year. 8 9 MR. FOGARTY: Good. Thank you. 10 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: My only comment 11 when we were reviewing this under financial 12 securities, and that would be more within the 13 Town itself, ideally it would be good if all 14 securities referenced the project number, because 15 at some point in time monies paid may be looked to be released. I don't know if the contractor 16 will be posting some of these and in some cases 17 their d/b/a for different securities. It could 18 be more than one. When the time comes to release 19 20 it, it's really difficult to track that all down. 21 MR. DONNELLY: I forgot to mention that 22 in condition 12 on page 18 we're going to add a 23 requirement that all applications -- for all 24 submissions having to do with financial 25 securities and inspection fees include the

NYC DEP DELAWARE AQUEDUCT REPAIR 1 19 2 project number. That's how we track everything here. It's impossible without it. 3 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Jerry? 4 5 MR. CANFIELD: Knowing how the 6 accounting department posts these securities, it would be beneficial if we could request that the 7 security be posted under the name of DEP or by 8 9 the DEP, simply because --10 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: I don't know if --11 are you willing to do that? 12 MR. CANFIELD: -- accounting lists --13 even though the project number, they can not handle and do it that way, by project number. We 14 15 are all accustomed to use the project number but accounting does not. Who ever's name is on the 16 17 check is what it gets listed under. MR. VILLARI: Well, I don't expect that 18 it's going to be the agency releasing the funds. 19 20 It's going to be the contractor who will be 21 required, as part of the spec, to cover these 22 performance bonds. 23 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: That's why their 24 names could vary left and right. 25 MR. DONNELLY: The Town suggested the

agreement with the Town cover how that's to be 2 handled. I would think the Town is going to want 3 the obligation to remain with the applicant, the 4 5 DEP, but the financial posting, or whatever is required to come from the contractor. But they 6 7 don't -- I wouldn't think they would want to see the contractor as the sole, you know, responsible 8 9 party because otherwise then they want full 10 bonding because they're relying upon the good 11 faith and full credit of the New York City DEP 12 and waiving some of that requirement. So you're 13 going to have to take that up with the Town 14 Board. I think Jerry's suggestion makes sense. 15 MR. VILLARI: Okay. Thank you. 16 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Do you agree with 17 everything that was said this evening? MR. PAGE: We do. 18 19 Then I'll move for CHATRMAN EWASUTYN: 20 a motion from the Board to grant site plan 21 approval for the New York City DEP Delaware 22 Aqueduct repair site plan subject to the 23 conditions that were presented by the Planning 24 Board Attorney, Mike Donnelly. 25 MR. GALLI: So moved.

2	MR. COCKS: The next item of Board
3	Business are four local laws sent to us by the
4	Town Board.
5	Would you like to go through each
6	individually?
7	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: For the record,
8	please.
9	MR. COCKS: First is regarding home
10	occupations in the Town of Newburgh. There were
11	several changes to the definition of home
12	occupation, including taxi service or yard and in
13	residential zones uses which entail maintenance,
14	services, repairing, loading or unloading or
15	storage of outdoor machinery, motor equipment or
16	commercial vehicles, outdoor activities conducted
17	on the property containing the dwelling.
18	They added several items that will
19	change. One is that the applicant will need to
20	go to the Zoning Board of Appeals for a special
21	permit. They have a new list of home occupations
22	that are prohibited, including a clinic, a
23	hospital, barbershop, beauty parlor, restaurant,
24	animal hospital, commercial animal breeding, and
25	uses in residential zones which include

2 maintenance, servicing, testing, cleaning, repair of outdoor machinery, loading, unloading, storage 3 of outdoor machinery, taxi or ambulance service 4 or yard. Any such use which has previously 5 received a special permit from the ZBA or 6 7 existing prior to prohibition of the building code shall be deemed nonconforming, and then 8 9 several other lists of new regulations regarding home occupations. 10

11 So we did discuss this at the Planning 12 Board work session and I will be working with 13 Mike Donnelly to send a letter to the Town Board 14 regarding four items that should be discussed 15 with zoning text amendments, which are whether 16 the use is permitted by the proposed change would be appropriate in the area concerned, whether 17 adequate public school facilities and other 18 public services exist or can be created to serve 19 20 the needs of any additional residences likely to 21 be constructed as a result of such a change, 22 whether the proposed change is in accord with any 23 existing or proposed plans in the vicinity, and 24 whether the proposed amendment is likely to result in an increase or decrease in the total 25

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PROPOSED LOCAL LAWS 1 29 zone residential capacity of the Town and the 2 probable effect thereof. 3 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Ouestions or 4 comments from Board Members? 5 MR. GALLI: No. 6 MR. FOGARTY: I have no comment. 7 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay. Then I'll 8 9 move for a motion to authorize Bryant Cocks and 10 Mike Donnelly to formalize a letter in response to this with our comments. 11 12 MR. GALLI: So moved. MR. MENNERICH: Second. 13 14 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: I have a motion by 15 Frank Galli. I have a second by Ken Mennerich. I'll ask for a roll call vote starting with Frank 16 Galli. 17 18 MR. That is a 9.4 acre 4 5 parcel, again bounded by Patton Road and South Plank Road. The change from the B to the R2 6 zoning district is also conditioned that the 7 property be used for single-family residences 8 9 consistent with the character of the adjoining 10 residential neighborhood as represented in the 11 owner's application for the amendment. 12 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay. I'll move 13 for a motion to -- in this case you'll be 14 managing just as a direct response to the Town 15 Board? 16 MR. COCKS: Yes. And that's not a 17 zoning text change, that's a zoning map 18 amendment. 19

19CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay. So Bryant20Cocks, Planning Consultant, will draft a letter21in response for the Planning Board.

22 I'll move for that motion.

COCKS: The final local law is 8 9 regarding the notification provisions for public 10 hearings for clearing and grading, subdivision of 11 land, telecommunications facilities and zoning. 12 The main changes to this are in regards to the 500-foot notification for all mailings for public 13 hearings; the inclusion of a notice to adjoining 14 15 applicants, which I don't have in this, at the 16 beginning of the process notifying them that a new proposal is coming in; the inclusion of an 17 18 11-by-17 inch copy of the notice being posted at the property, which also needs to have a 19 20 notarized affidavit of posting and a photograph 21 of the posting. That's to be sent to the 22 secretary of the ZBA. And also a change in the 23 description in the notice of hearing which will 24 now include the size of the lot, the size of each building's footprint, the number of stories in 25

2 height and a detailed description of the proposed use provided by the applicant. 3 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: I'll move for a 4 5 motion to have Bryant Cocks and Mike Donnelly respond on behalf of the Planning Board with some 6 concerns that we may have and a difficulty in 7 implementing. 8 9 MR. DONNELLY: We took notes of those 10 during the work session. 11 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Notes were taken 12 during the work session. 13 MR. GALLI: So moved. MR.
