Dear Jim:

Thank you for your letter of May 17, 2002, in which you advise that the Town Board has granted the above captioned project a waiver from the requirement to construct a private road to access Lakeside Road, as said waiver was requested by the Town Planning Board, thereby allowing the intended subdivision to access Lakeside Road by a common driveway.

Your letter sets forth the requirement that certain notes be placed on the subdivision map and in the deeds conveying the lots to any purchasers, specifically stating that the approved lots shall not be further subdivided and that no more than three single family dwellings shall be located on the three lots.

As I stated at the Town Board meeting of May 2, 2012, my client does not object to the Panning Board's request that the three lots utilize a common drive, nor does he object to the Town Board request that the lots not be further subdivided, and he is in support of this restriction. The Town Board then moved and approved the proposal.

However, the condition that the subdivision be limited to single family homes was not a part of the motion and approval. The property is zoned for one and two family homes and the intended use of the lots contemplates this zoning if all governing Town regulations are met. The May 2^{nd} motion and approval limits this parcel to three lots with no further subdivision approval and my client has no problem with this. He does not want to preclude the possibility of building a two family home on one of the lots, specifically Lot #1, as allowed by the zoning.

The existing Town regulations require that any lot upon which a two family home is requested requires a separate, specific, individual application and approval to and from the Town beyond the approval granting the subdivision. Therefore any note restricting the lots to single family homes is unnecessary. Should anyone wish to build a two family home on one of the lots, they must file an application and obtain approval from the Town. Consequently, at the time of application for a two family use the Town can mandate that the lot housing a two family home will not be allowed to use the common drive and will require its own drive access to Lakeside Road, if the Town so desires. In our case only Lot #1 could meet that condition, having direct lot frontage on Lakeside Road, while the other two lots front on the common drive and do not have the required unfettered frontage on Lakeside Road.

For these reasons my client requests that the wording referencing single family homes be eliminated, particularly since it was not part of the motion of approval.

As you may recall, the Police Departments last K-9 was retired in February. As a result, this is the first time in many years that there hasn't been a K-9 in service.

There are a number of positive reasons for having K-9's in a Police Department. Besides utilizing K-9's for officer protection and suspect apprehension, they are valuable for other uses such as searching for people and evidence, narcotics detection, explosives detection and public relations. The ability to utilize K-9's for searches alone can save a great deal of expense and man-hours in a department our size.

At this time I am requesting that the Board consider allowing the Police Department to re-build the K-9 Unit. If approved, we would start the process of interviewing for up to two (2) new K-9 handlers as soon as possible. We would then search for suitable dogs. The handlers and dogs would then have time to get familiar before the start of formal K-9 training which would most likely start in September.

The 2012 Police Budget has \$10,000 allocated for K-9's and there is several thousand dollars in a T-account designated for K-9. According to several current and former K-9 trainers, pre-tested dogs are estimated to cost \$5,000-6,000 each with a guarantee from the seller. Of course, there is always a chance that suitable dogs could be purchased for less.

The PBA has recently advised me that a local business has offered to donate \$12,000 to the PBA for the purchase of new dogs. Assuming the Board allows the program to start up again and the donation is made, the PBA would agree to purchase the dogs and then sign them over to the Town for the K-9 program.

Again, I am requesting that the Board consider this request for re-building the K-9 Unit. New, well-trained handlers and dogs could serve the Department and the residents for years to come.
