Attached please find the proposed Consent Order and Judgment in reference to the aboveentitled proceedings. The Town of Newburgh, the Valley Central School District, the County of Orange, and any special district for which taxes are levied based on the assessments made subject to this agreement, shall forthwith audit, pay and refund to Petitioner principal amounts of excess taxes paid by petitioner, all refund drafts being payable to "STAVITSKY & ASSOCIATES, LLC, as attorneys for Petitioner"; and said refunds should be tendered to Stavitsky & Associates, LLC, 350 Passaic Avenue, Fairfield, New Jersey 07004. Said refunds shall be for repayment of excess principal taxes paid and shall be made in accordance with local refunding procedures established and provided for such cases. Petitioner waives statutory interest from all refunds paid by the Town, County and School District if paid within 60 days of service of this Consent Order and Judgment with notice of entry thereon.

HACKER MURPHY, LLP ATTORNEYS AT LAW 6. If applicable, corrected or amended property tax bills shall be furnished to petitioner by the Town of Newburgh, the County of Orange and/or the Valley Central School District, for any subsequent tax billing date for which amended tax bills are in order consistent with the terms and conditions of this agreement.

7. The judicial proceedings as to the assessed value of the subject property in dispute for 2011, 2012 and 2013, are being simultaneously compromised, settled and discontinued in accordance with the terms of this agreement without costs or disbursements and the parties are signifying, by their subscribing to the terms and conditions hereof, a full final and binding settlement of the special proceedings entitled above.

8. Real Property Tax Law §727 shall apply to this proceeding. Acknowledging the applicability of RPTL §727, the petitioner agrees not to file judicial petitions challenging the assessments of the subject property in 2014, 2015 and 2016 and also not to file any administrative grievances with the Board of Assessment Review as long as the assessed valuation of the subject property as agreed to for 2013 is not changed for 2014, 2015 and 2016, subject to the exceptions as set forth in Real Property Tax Law §727.

9. This Consent Order will be submitted to the New York State Supreme Court for signature and entry, and this proceeding shall thereupon be discontinued on the merits, without costs in favor of any party against another, subject to compliance with the refund provisions made part hereof. Any party may move this Court on notice to the other for any relief it shall deem appropriate for the construction or enforcement of this agreement.

Subject: Equipment Proposal

The Police Department's 2013 budget included funding for five marked police vehicles. As manpower has not increased the mileage on the current fleet has not significantly increased. In fact, the mileage being put on the marked vehicles has declined so much that we are just now putting marked vehicles purchased in 2012 in service. With that being said, we will not need two of the marked vehicles budgeted for 2013. Those two vehicles and associated equipment would average \$58,000.00.

I am requesting to use that money for equipment imperative to the operation of the Police Department. The equipment proposed is as follows:

1. Radio & Telephone Recording System: The current recording system has not been working for several weeks. The system is old and we do not have a maintenance contract at this time. We have had requests from the District Attorney's Office, Defense Attorneys and Courts for recordings of radio transmissions and telephone conversations that we have not been able to provide due to the system not working. In addition, we are unable to properly investigate personnel complaints when related to a radio transmission or telephone call. These problems have the potential to put added liability on the Town should there be a question about police response to a call for service.

We are requesting to purchase a Verint Audio Log Recording System. This item is on state bid with a purchase price of \$17,879.00, which includes five years of maintenance.

2. Network Reconfiguration: Network reconfiguration is necessary to safeguard our computer systems, allow more efficient use of computers installed in patrol

vehicles and reduction in the amount of time officers spend doing paperwork inside headquarters. Two-thirds of our patrol vehicles are currently equipped with laptop computers and we expect additional laptops to be installed in the next couple of months. In the past year officers using vehicles with laptops have been able to complete traffic tickets and accident reports in the vehicle thus eliminating handwritten paperwork and reducing time spent at traffic stops and accidents. During this time we have also seen an increase in citations being issued. Ideally, officers should be able to complete other types of reports, search for records and perform other vital tasks from their vehicle laptops. We can move in that direction by reconfiguring our network. Reconfiguration will also provide better security for our computer system. Our current firewall cannot handle traffic from additional computers that will be added to our system in the next couple of months. There is also no support for our current firewall as it is outdated. Reconfiguration will also provide Iprism which is an internet monitoring program to prevent access to unauthorized internet sites. We have obtained a quote in the amount \$27,059.51 for the proposed reconfiguration from the Town of New Windsor's IT Department, please see attached.

3. **Defibrillators**: We currently only have one working defibrillator which is located in the lobby of the station. It is outdated and needs to be replaced. We would like to purchase five, three to be kept in patrol vehicles and an additional two to be kept in the station. The approximate cost for a defibrillator unit is \$1,500.00.

Pursuant to the terms of Article IX of the General Conditions of the above-referenced Contract, the Contractor is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the extra work as described below. The Contractor agrees to furnish all labor, material and equipment needed to accomplish these changes in accordance with the applicable portions of the Contract Documents and/or as required in the Modifications.

Modification

Requirement:

- Supply replacement LayneOx media in sealed bags for the three 10'-0" diameter filter vessels. The new medial shall meet the same specifications as the media that was originally installed. Media will be installed by the Owner under the supervision of Layne.
 - Supply replacement filter gravel in sealed bags for the bottom portion of the three filter vessels. The new gravel material shall meet the same specifications as the gravel that was originally installed. The gravel will be installed by the Owner under the supervision of Layne.

Prior to loading the gravel and media the Owner will be responsible for:

- o Flushing and disinfecting the upstream and downstream piping systems and equipment to prevent recontamination.
- Thoroughly cleaning the interior of the three filter vessels and plenum areas via use of a n low pressure water spray to remove residual media or debris.
- Inspection of the filter vessel internals (hub/lateral/nozzles/etc.) This inspection is to 0 be performed under the supervision of Layne.
- o Disinfect the three filter vessels and all interior piping as noted above with a water/liquid chlorine solution with a minimum of 100 ppm chlorine residual.
- 0 After 24 hours, flush the disinfecting water from the three vessels and pipelines dechlorinate the water, and dispose of the water through its lagoon system.

Upon successful completion of the Owners responsibilities listed above, Layne will supervise the loading of the supplied gravel and media. The media will be placed in the filters by the Owner. After the media has been placed the Owner will be responsible for the following tasks prior to start-up:

- o Fill the three filter vessels and interior piping with effluent water from the Town of
- Newburg Water Treatment Plant.
- Backwash and scrape media as needed to remove fines. o
- Disinfect/activate the new LayneOx media in accordance with a procedure supplied by Ò Layne
- Ò Perform bacteria testing.

Clarifications:

Upon completion of the requirements of this Change Order the Contractor shall correct the following deficiencies or defective work to satisfy substantial and final completion:

Restore the filter operating program to its original sequence whereby each filter will o backwash independently based on either differential pressure across the individual pressure, a preselected time, or manually at the option of the Operator. Set air wash to occur with every backwash.

- Demonstrate the uniformity of the air scour system prior to loading the media with water in the vessel to a depth of 9-12" above the air scour laterals.
- o Demonstrate the uniformity of the backwash water distribution/collection system.
- o Demonstrate that the backwash operation meets the flow rates recommended by the manufacturer as adjusted for the water temperature. Demonstrate that excessive backwashing is not necessary to continue cleaning the media in the future.
- o Demonstrate that the filters effectively remove manganese as specified.
- o Operate valves open/close to verify operation.
- o Check primary devices for operability and signal output to panel.
- o Verify chemical feed rates, recommend adjustments as needed.
- o Start service run, record clean bed pressure drop.
- o Monitor service run for effluent manganese and differential pressure development.
- o Terminate service run on manganese breakthrough or high differential pressure.
- o Air wash.
- Backwash monitor waste quality and time to clear up
- o Based on results of demonstration, re-set control program settings
- Provide updated 0 & M manual documenting final filter control programming and recommended control settings. Include recommendations for seasonal or water quality based adjustments such as water temperature based adjustments to backwash flow rate.
- The Owner will perform laboratory testing for confirmation of media cleanliness after a minimum of three backwash cycles, iron, manganese, and bacteria levels and operate all plant equipment external to the LayneOX filter system.

A certificate of substantial completion, release of lien affidavit and warranty bonds were prepared and executed by DiLorenzo prior to this change order. New forms will not be required.

Provide a one-year warranty for the filter media and filter control programming commencing on the future date that the system is placed into acceptable operating condition on or about August 30, 2013. Layne will checkout the components of its filtration system for operability while on site, but it is understood that warranty for components that have sat idle for close to 2 years has expired. If parts or components require replacement, Layne will provide a quote for those items as necessary.

- The Owner agrees to monitor the biological activity through the entire Chadwick Lake water filtration system of the water supplied to the manganese filtration system and agrees to provide water to the new filtration system of a quality whereby excessive bacteria will not be delivered to the manganese filtration system. The Owner also agrees to monitor and record the individual filter run time between backwashes.
- The Owner will manage the operation of its waste holding lagoons to provide sufficient storage to hold the initial backwash waste volume from a filter. The backwashing of consecutive filters may be limited by time required to treat the backwash water for discharge.
- Payment for materials delivered to the site will be made within 25 days of delivery and receipt of a payment request. Payment for the remaining work included in this Change Order and all other outstanding retainage currently withheld will be processed to Dilorenzo General Building Contractor upon completion of this Change Order work.

In the event that repair, replacement, or modification of the filter system components is required as a result of issues not related to the deficiencies or defects identified in this Change Order, Contractor will submit a separate proposal for these services. Upon acceptance, Contractor's costs will be billed based on Subcontractor's invoice plus a 5% mark up plus 2% for bonds. In accordance with our April 5, 2012 and April 10,2013 meetings, O'Brien & Gere has led the investigation identifying the cause and remedy for the fouling of the filter media in the new manganese removal filters since Hurricane Irene in August 2011. We subsequently provided continuing support to secure FEMA funding for the repairs. Our investigations identified a number of possible contributing factors. As discussed on April 5, 2012, the fact that the breakdown in performance of the manganese filters occurred immediately after the Hurricane supports the conclusion that the overwhelming bacteriological load in the water coming into the plant from Chadwick Lake and passing through the conventional plant resulted in the irreversible fouling of the manganese removal media. O'Brien & Gere respectfully requests authorization to invoice the Town for our actual costs of the investigation, negotiations with the supplier and contractor and oversight of the re-commissioning of the filters. The services included:

- Coordination with the Contractor, Filter Vendor, and laboratory to complete media sampling.
- Evaluation of potential media cleaning alternatives.
- Meeting with the Town, Contractor and Filter Vendor on December 20, 2011.
- Preparation for and participation in conference call with Town, and Filter Vendor on January 20, 2012.
- Preparation for and participation in conference call with Town, and Filter Vendor on March 14, 2012.
- Preparation of standard operating protocols to monitor the water quality, operations and performance of the plants and operational procedures to prevent future fouling.
- April 5, 2012 Meeting with the Town.
- Coordination with the manufacturer of the conventional filters to evaluate the conventional filter performance and develop procedures for cleaning the conventional media.
- Development of supporting information to secure a FEMA grant.
- Negotiation of a Change Order with the General Contractor to replace the filter media and recommission the filtration system.
- continuing contract administration services to monitor the re-commissioning of the manganese filtration system.

Based on the results of both deep test pits and percolation rate tests, there is suitable soils near the Commissioner's office / building on the west side of the lake to support the installation of a subsurface disposal system for park visitors. Therefore, I am requesting Town Board approval for Phase 3.0 of Maser's 10 June 2013 proposal – Septic System Design at a not-to-exceed cost of \$2,200. Final design will include an aerobic treatment unit, a pump chamber and an Eljen or chambered adsorption field to minimize the length of the adsorption field and subsequently the amount of ground disturbance. Soil and erosion control measures will be required to protect the water quality of Chadwick Lake Reservoir.

As the above requires Town Board action, I am requesting that this item be placed on the next available agenda for approval. If you have any questions or comments, I am available to discuss them with you.

As you know, the Board has previously approved a Letter Agreement which is dated February 14, 2013 between NYC-DEP and the Town regarding the provision of Town water to the New York City Department of Environmental Protection Water for the Future [Delaware Aqueduct Roundout – West Branch Tunnel Repair Program] project. Upon reviewing the plans for the 12-inch diameter water main between the water plant and the approved connection location at the corner of Route 9W and Old Post Road, the Supervisor and Code Compliance Supervisor requested that NYC install fire hydrants on the main as a public safety improvement.

Pursuant to the letter agreement, the water main will remain NYC's until it completes its project, and at that time the main will, at the Town's option, either be dedicated and conveyed to the Town or abandoned and removed. While NYC sees no benefit to it from the installation of the hydrants on its water main, it has agreed to install them, subject to the Town agreeing to assume all responsibility and liability for the hydrants including any damage to the water main and to indemnify NYC, hold it harmless and defend it from any damages and claims arising out of the use, operation and maintenance of the hydrants and to add NYC as an additional insured to the Town's liability policy and maintain coverage in the current amounts. If water is used at the hydrants, the Town will be responsible for its provision and cost. The terms are set forth in the attached proposed amendment to the Letter Agreement

When duly countersigned where indicated below, this amendment ("Amendment") will amend the Letter Agreement, dated February 14, 2013(the "Letter Agreement") between the Town of Newburgh (the "Town") and the City of New York (the "City"), acting by and through its Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") related to the water main DEP will be building in connection with the Water for the Future ("WFF") project. A copy of the Letter Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The Letter Agreement is hereby amended as follows:

- DEP will, at the Town's request, install fire hydrants in the New York State Department of Transportation right of way along NYS Route 9W. The fire hydrants will be above ground structures connected to the subsurface water main DEP is building pursuant to Section 8 of the Letter Agreement ("Water Main").
- 2. The Town assumes all responsibility and liability for all aspects of operation and maintenance of the fire hydrants, including, but not limited to, providing the necessary water to operate the fire hydrants.
- 3. The Town acknowledges that DEP is responsible only for maintaining the Water Main between the PRV structure to be located at the corner of NYS Route 9W and Old Post Road to the DEP construction Site located at 5497-5543 NYS Route 9W during the construction of the Rondout-West Branch Tunnel ("RWBT") bypass tunnel expected to be completed in 2022. After construction of the RWBT bypass,

the DEP intends to (transfer ownership in) the Water Main to the Town who would thereafter be responsible for maintaining the Water Main.

- 4. The Town assumes all responsibility and liability for damage to the Water Main arising from the use of the fire hydrants.
- 5. The Town assumes all responsibility and liability for any damage allegedly arising from the use, operation, or maintenance of the fire hydrants.
- 6. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Town shall indemnify, defend and hold the City, its employees and agents (the "Indemnitees") harmless against any and all claims (including but not limited to claims asserted by any employee of the Town, its contractors, consultants and/or subcontractors) and costs and expenses of whatever kind (including but not limited to payment or reimbursement of reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements) allegedly arising out of the use, operation, or maintenance of the fire hydrants. Such costs and expenses shall include all those incurred in defending the underlying claim and those incurred in connection with the enforcement of this Section by way of cross-claim, third-party claim, declaratory action or otherwise.
- 7. The Town will carry general liability coverage of \$1,000,000 \$3,000,0000, with a \$10,000,000 umbrella at all times throughout the term of this Agreement. Such insurance is currently issued by U.S. Specialty Insurance Company. The Town will ensure that the "City of New York, its officials and employees" are added as additional insured on such insurance policy, and will provide to the City a copy of the certificate of insurance, policy endorsement and broker's certification and

any other documentation the City reasonably requests in connection with such insurance coverage.
