NYC DEP 1 MR. PROFACI: Good evening, ladies 2 and gentlemen. Welcome to the Town of 3 Newburgh Planning Board meeting of October 2, 4 2014. 5 At this time I'll ask for a roll 6 call starting with Frank Galli. 7 MR. GALLI: Present. 8 9 MR. BROWNE: Present. 10 MR. MENNERICH: Present. 11 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Present. 12 MR. PROFACT: Here. MR. DOMINICK: Present. 13 MR. WARD: Present. 14 15 MR. PROFACI: The Planning Board 16 employs various consultants to advise the 17 Board on matters of importance, including State Environmental Quality Review Act, 18 otherwise known as SEQRA, issues. I ask them 19 to introduce themselves at this time. 20 21 MR. DONNELLY: Michael Donnelly, 22 Planning Board Attorney. 23 MS. CONERO: Michelle Conero, 24 Stenographer. 25 MR. HINES: Pat Hines with McGoey,

NYC DEP 1 3 2 Hauser & Edsall Consulting Engineers. MR. PROFACI: Thank you. At this time 3 I'll turn the meeting over to Cliff Browne. 4 5 MR. BROWNE: Please rise and join me in 6 the Pledge. (Pledge of Allegiance.) 7 MR. BROWNE: Would you please shut off 8 9 your devices so we don't get interrupted by bells 10 and buzzers. 11 MR. PROFACI: The first item on 12 tonight's agenda is the New York City DEP Delaware Aqueduct Repair, project 2013-05. 13 It is 14 a project update, associated field changes and 15 amendments, Section 8, Block 1, Lots 15.2 and 16 22.2, located in the B/AR Zone, being represented by Chris Villari. 17 18 MR. VILLARI: Thank you very much, as always, for having us. It's good to see you 19 20 guys. It's been a year since we were last here. 21 As always, I do want to hand out a roll 22 call of all the folks that are here with me. 23 This evening I have with me Shane Odar 24 who is part of the communications group from DEP; I have Dan Michaud who all of you folks have met 25

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2 before; Phil Simmons; and George Schmitt, the
3 construction manager for the work going on here
4 and in Wappingers.

5 We are going to talk about maybe five 6 or six different things, some of which is old 7 business, some of which is upcoming business. 8 I'll introduce the other folks on the team in 9 more detail.

10 I do want to preface this by saying one 11 major item we are going to bring up today is that 12 we are interested in extending the work to 13 Saturdays. We did send you guys a letter 14 formally requesting that, and Phil Simmons will 15 reference it. We ask that tonight. The main 16 order of business is to get approval to do the 17 work on Saturdays, and then some of the other more miscellaneous stuff we'll cover. 18

So should I start with George for the Saturday work?

21 MR. SCHMITT: Good evening. Basically 22 the project has been running now with the shaft 23 work for about nine months, ten months. We had 24 an issue back in the end of June with our crane. 25 The crane had a major failure which required the

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2 contractor to switch out cranes so we lost about three weeks' time. The site in Newburgh here is 3 the site that's critical as far as the timeline 4 because it's a deeper shaft, it takes longer to 5 get it finished than the other shaft in Newburgh 6 7 which is only 700 feet deep. We're requesting that we work on Saturdays. The contractors' 8 9 activities will be strictly limited to mucking 10 out the shaft and drilling holes down in the 11 shaft to about 325 feet deep at this point. So 12 we weren't going to look to do any blasting, any 13 other site work or anything like that. 14 Specifically just production work, which will be 15 called production work, which keeps the project 16 on schedule and hopefully makes up some more 17 time. 18 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Just for the record, would you go through the hours? 19 20 MR. SCHMITT: It would be a typical 7 21 to 4. I don't think we're looking to do anything 22 more than that. 23 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Just for 24 communication, the crane problem that you had, what was that problem, just for education? 25

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2	MR. SCHMITT: The crane the drum of
3	the crane is run on a series of hydraulic motors.
4	One of the motors failed and the crane is I
5	think it was thirty-six years old. It was well
6	used and a heavily used crane. So we had spoken
7	with the contractor. The root cause of the
8	failure was not conveyed to us in a manner where
9	we were satisfied, so we told them until they
10	told us what it was that failed, and they
11	couldn't really tell us. They went to the
12	manufacturer and the manufacturer basically told
13	them it's an old crane, this is what happens.
14	It's not something that's made for this type of
15	work. They went out and procured a crane at
16	their own cost. It probably cost them
17	\$3,000,000. We told them we would support if
18	they switched the crane out, we told them we
19	would support them when it came to assessing any
20	delays at the end of the job. We're trying to
21	work with them to get the job on time. This is
22	one of their proposals that they came back with.
23	They were falling behind schedule. This is one

some of the productive work, which we don't feel

of the proposals they came back to look to extend

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2	on our end is going to impact anything as far as
3	the rest of the site. It strictly would be shaft
4	work, drilling out and cleaning out the shaft
5	once after a blast but no blasting activities.
6	MR. HINES: The Saturday work was
7	always permitted for site work. It's the shaft
8	work that was restricted. I think you're 250
9	some feet down.
10	MR. SCHMITT: 325 feet.
11	MR. HINES: So that work that they're
12	doing is going to be a football field below grade
13	as a noise issue.
14	MR. SCHMITT: It's just lifting up a
15	bucket, dumping it, sending it back down.
16	They'll go all day long, thirty-five, forty,
17	forty-five buckets in an eight-hour shift,
18	roughly. And then if they are drilling, they'll
19	probably get three-quarters of the area drilled
20	out and that way it will be ready to load on
21	Monday morning, and if they were to do the
22	blasting at this point. So we had told them we
23	didn't want them doing trucking. The site work
24	they're not looking to do the site work
25	because it's not in the critical path. Strictly

2	the shaft work is on the critical path to get
3	them back on schedule.
4	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Questions from
5	Board Members?
6	MR. BROWNE: No trucking, just the
7	shaft?
8	MR. SCHMITT: Yes.
9	MR. BROWNE: Would this extend from
10	the way you described it, my assumption is that
11	it would only be I'm sorry. That the Saturday
12	work would cease once the shaft is at that
13	MR. SCHMITT: Correct.
14	MR. BROWNE: Okay.
15	MR. SCHMITT: Which at that point we
16	will be in the process of another contract, which
17	again I don't think that was it's not in that
18	part of the approval anyway.
19	MR. HINES: No. That was only the
20	discussion of the shaft. I think the reason was
21	that that work is going to be some 900 feet below
22	grade after that.
23	MR. BROWNE: Thank you.
24	MR. DONNELLY: Is there any need to
25	amend your SEQRA findings? Was that also a

NYC DEP 1 findings condition or just a site plan 2 resolution? 3 MR. SCHMITT: I believe it was a site 4 5 plan. MR. SIMMONS: The site plan resolution 6 followed from the SEQRA findings. 7 MR. DONNELLY: You're the lead agency. 8 9 MR. SIMMONS: We'll put a letter in the 10 file. We don't expect any adverse impacts or 11 existing -- the noise mitigation plan will stay in effect. 12 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: John Ward? 13 14 MR. WARD: I have a question later. 15 MR. GALLI: Have you had any noise 16 complaints? 17 MR. SCHMITT: No. Not at all. Actually, the data we have is strictly the 18 19 traffic on Route 9W. 20 MR. GALLI: That's normal. MR. SCHMITT: That's the one that 21 22 triggers the bulk of the noise. 23 MR. VILLARI: We should add our 24 construction management staff has a dedicated 25 person who communicates with our neighbors

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immediately around before and after any blasting. 2 So we're very tight with all of them. 3 MR. SCHMITT: We have a nine-person --4 5 nine-person group that we deal with the surrounding properties. We give them a call 6 before each blast, tell them when it's going to 7 happen, ask if there's any concerns. We usually 8 9 set up a seismograph. We alternate the 10 properties, go from one to the other to get 11 seismograph readings on those properties. 12 MR. GALLI: Have they been in range of 13 what you thought? 14 MR. SCHMITT: Yeah. They were all 15 within ten percent of what the max allowable is. MR. MICHAUD: We just had them over the 16 site, was it last week? 17 18 MR. SCHMITT: We did on Monday. 19 MR. MICHAUD: I showed them around and kind of gave an open house to keep a comfort 20 21 level with the neighbors. 22 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Every now and then 23 you have to mention your name. MR. MICHAUD: Dan Michaud. 24 25 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Any other questions

4	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: How much of a lead
5	time and would it be possible for the Board and
6	its consultants to I think last time we were
7	up there the shaft was at like 20 feet. Can we
8	possibly get up there in the course of time
9	and
10	MR. SCHMITT: Yeah.
11	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: update?
12	MR. SCHMITT: Right now we have two
13	more blasts, one is tomorrow, one will probably
14	be Tuesday or Wednesday. From there we are going
15	to start a concrete cycle. So going down to be
16	bottom of the shaft there's going to be concrete
17	up so the workers won't be at the bottom of the
18	shaft, they'll be working their way out. Once
19	the next blasting cycle, probably five to six
20	weeks, we could look to set something up. Sure.
21	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Keep us in the loop
22	and then we'll come together with a list of
23	people.
24	MR. SCHMITT: Okay. I'd say six weeks
25	tentatively. Maybe right before Thanksgiving,

NYC DEP 1 2 right after. Somewhere around there. 3 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Great. Pat Hines, do you have anything to add? 4 MR. HINES: No. Not for that. The 5 noise protocol will still be there so that 6 monitoring will be available if there's any 7 complaints. I think the depth they're at, 8 9 they're not going to impact any of their 10 neighbors. 11 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay. So they'll 12 be mucking out and drilling. The hours will be between 7 and 4 on Saturdays. 13 14 Mike, would you speak. 15 MR. DONNELLY: I think you should do it with the formality of a motion to amend the site 16 plan approval to allow the Saturday work. 17 MR. HINES: I think they have a couple 18 19 more changes. 20 MR. GALLI: On the hours, is it -- you 21 can go 7 to 7. Can't they? MR. DONNELLY: If you're talking about 22 23 our code, I believe those are the hours. 24 MR. GALLI: You only want 7 to 4? 25 MR. SCHMITT: We made it 7 to 4, yes.

3	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: So Mike, for the
4	audience, for the Stenographer, would you give
5	the language for granting
6	MR. DONNELLY: This portion would be a
7	motion to amend the site plan approval, to modify
8	the condition that prohibited tunnel work on
9	Saturdays to allow limited tunnel work in the
10	nature of mucking and drilling between the hours
11	of 7 and 4.
12	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay.
13	MR. HINES: Where you said tunnel,
14	we're going to say shaft.
15	MR. SCHMITT: Before I lose track of my
16	thought, there may be times when they may look to
17	do a maintenance shift as well, which is just
18	maintenance on equipment and no other productive
19	work.
20	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Mucking out,
21	drilling and maintenance.
22	MR. HINES: The maintenance is
23	permitted under the previous approvals.
24	MR. SCHMITT: I just wanted to mention
25	that.

2	MR. HINES: Site work is allowed. It
3	was strictly the shaft work that was restricted
4	in the original approval.
5	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: So we won't add
6	maintenance.
7	MR. HINES: It's permitted.
8	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay. Having heard
9	the language for an amended schedule for work
10	presented by Mike Donnelly, I'll move for that
11	motion.
12	MR. GALLI: So moved.
13	MR. PROFACI: Second.
14	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: I have a motion by
15	Frank Galli, a second by Joe Profaci. Any
16	discussion of the motion?
17	(No response.)
18	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: I'll move for a
19	roll call vote starting with Frank Galli.
20	MR. GALLI: Aye.
21	MR. BROWNE: Aye.
22	MR. MENNERICH: Aye.
23	MR. PROFACI: Aye.
24	MR. DOMINICK: Aye.
25	MR. WARD: Aye.

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2 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Ave. 3 Is there anything else you want to talk about? 4 5 MR. VILLARI: Yes. We do have a few more items. I'd like to ask Phil to step 6 forward. The next thing we'd actually like to 7 discuss is the stream crossing over by the Poland 8 9 Spring property on 9W. We have made some minor 10 changes that we wanted to present to you guys to 11 make a more formal submission. We came prepared 12 for that. MR. SIMMONS: George will help me out. 13 14 What we had originally been permitted to do was put our water main and our force main along 9W. 15 This is Old Post Road, this is the Colandrea 16 property with the Poland Spring tenant. 17 Originally we were going to run the lines here, 18 cross the stream. This is where the stream runs 19 20 here. Basically connect the two green parts, and 21 we're going to have to put a dog leg in it 22 because we found a gas line that we didn't 23 anticipate. In order to cross it safely we need to run this way. We'll be working -- we've been 24 25 working with the property owners to make sure we

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get proper permission from them. We're working with the Army Corp and DEC to make sure we get the appropriate permits. We also need to come to you because this would be a different field change relative to our existing site plan approval.

8 George, I don't know if you have9 anything.

10 MR. SCHMITT: It's basically the same 11 means and methods of work. We were supposed to 12 come down to about this point and then jack the 13 pipe underneath the stream here and then come 14 back on this line. We found that as we jacked 15 the pipe under the stream it crosses under 16 Central Hudson's gas line as well. Central Hudson won't allow us to cross their live gas 17 line without it being exposed and visually 18 inspected. So it basically takes away this 19 20 option. So we're coming back here where the pipe 21 is closer to the right-of-way, we're going to 22 cross it by digging up and exposing it here and 23 then crossing the stream at this point, and then 24 just retracing the pipe back down to the original 25 spot.

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NYC DEP 1 2 MR. HINES: Ken, that's that TP line; 3 right? That's a big one. MR. SCHMITT: It's a twelve-inch. 4 5 MR. MENNERICH: Where you're going --6 the new location you're going to come across, 7 you'll be able to expose it? MR. SCHMITT: Yes. It runs pretty much 8 9 along the edge of the road here. We were always 10 on the west side. As we crossed the stream --11 this is it right here actually. Right here. As 12 we cross the stream we had to cross underneath it as well. Central Hudson's policy. We worked out 13 14 with them now -- they also wanted us to run a pipe their pipe here. We worked it out where we 15 16 can run it over by exposing a bigger area of 17 pipe, so they're satisfied it's not being 18 damaged, and then placing fill and our pipe over the top of it. This is going to be a temporary, 19 20 for the most part, set up, especially force main. 21 They were okay with that. 22 MR. GALLI: You said temporary setup. 23 What happens --24 MR. SCHMITT: The force main is just 25 built for the project. It's going to come out at

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2 the end of the project. The water main is going 3 to stay for the Town's use, about 1,500 feet up the road. 4 5 MR. HINES: The force main is designed to just run dewatering, water down to the Hudson 6 River. 7 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: So that would be an 8 9 accepted field change at this point? 10 MR. HINES: Yeah. Just that plan needs 11 to get updated, and the SWPPP too. That's the 12 only issue. MR. SIMMONS: We do have drawings today 13 14 we can leave with you. The SWPPP isn't quite 15 prepared. The SWPPP amendment should come in in 16 the next week or so. 17 MR. HINES: Okay. CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Chris, do you have 18 any other matters that you want to bring? 19 20 MR. VILLARI: We do, if you don't mind. 21 So Phil I think will actually -- we're going to 22 talk about landscaping. 23 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, the landscaping. Unfortunately we ran into an issue with the 24 landscaping along 9W. We had six Shadblow trees 25

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2 that wouldn't fit along the edge of the property because of some survey issues. The right-of-way 3 for the DOT was a little bit further to the west. 4 5 So we have six Shadblow trees that were going to 6 go along the edge of the stormwater basin. We 7 can't put them next to the road in that right-of-way. We've been in touch with Karen 8 9 Arent to see if we could find another place to 10 put them. She had a suggestion and we've looked 11 into this place, but unfortunately with the 12 geology and the grading they won't fit there. So 13 what we're going to have to do is go back to the 14 drawing board and see if we can find a place for 15 those trees.

16 We also know that with other developments coming up -- as you know, we're 17 18 looking to purchase the Bell property. We 19 realize we have to come up with another landscape 20 plan in any case. So with this particular field 21 change, the six trees we have to move, we'll add 22 those in to our overall landscape plan we'll be 23 submitting as a formal amendment in the future. 24 It will cover the Bell property, this particular 25 field change and some other minor field changes

2	as far as landscaping goes.
3	MR. GALLI: I drove by there yesterday
4	and it looks nice. One tree was a little crooked
5	but
6	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: So you'll
7	consolidate everything into one complete
8	landscape plan?
9	MR. SIMMONS: Exactly. Obviously if we
10	doubled the site we'll have to submit another
11	amendment.
12	CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Okay.
13	MR. VILLARI: This is Chris Villari
14	again. I think when we contract I know we had
15	a few things more to discuss. Maybe we can just
16	circle back to some older business.
17	I guess the last time I think we were
18	here we had discussed changes to the retaining
19	walls and the design on site. So we've made I
20	think we're making some additional changes now.
21	Phil, would you mind going through
22	that?
23	MR. SIMMONS: George, jump in when you
24	need to for the technical issues.
25	Relative to our access road, we talked

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NYC DEP

2 about the Gabion walls and other retaining walls about a year ago that we'd like to put in there. 3 4 Also along the blasted rock face, along the 5 interior road we've -- we're going to put what we 6 call rock bolts to stabilize, and also cover 7 those with Shotcrete, so sprayed on concrete. And then further up the road we've run into a 8 9 slope stabilization issue where the top of rock 10 wasn't where we thought it would be relative to 11 the design. So we've run into essentially an 12 emergency soil stabilization issue. We're going 13 to use soil nails and again more Shotcrete on the 14 interior of the site to make certain we can 15 stabilize the slopes. This will be another field 16 change, another site plan amendment. We'll also 17 relate to the SWPPP. We can get that to you in 18 the next week or so, the SWPPP portion. So we 19 can make sure we again make certain all the 20 drawings and the site plan are current.

Again, due to the emergency situation or the -- because of the stabilization issue, we wanted to make certain that was taken care of. So we're moving forward with that as we speak. MR. HINES: There's a good portion of

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2 that done already. I've seen it in the SWPPP 3 reports.

4 MR. SIMMONS: One thing to keep in mind 5 is all the Shotcrete is on the interior of the 6 site. You can't see it from exterior. When we 7 deal with the Bell landscaping and have 8 renderings and what not, we'll be able to show 9 you evidence that that's interior to the site and 10 not visible from the road.

MR. HINES: They may be able to see
that at their site visit if that coincides.
MR. SIMMONS: You'll be able to see it.

14 MR. BROWNE: As a novice, what is a 15 soil nail?

16 MR. SCHMITT: It's basically the same 17 as a rock bolt. It holds the soil in place. It's basically a drilled hole about five inches 18 in diameter, like this, they stick a steel rod 19 20 that's coated with -- basically coated so the 21 environment doesn't wear away and wear away the 22 steel, and it's grouted in place with cement. It 23 basically -- it's like sticking a toothpick in a 24 sandwich basically, for lack of a better term. 25 It holds everything together. It's the same as a

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2 rock bolt but --

3 MR. HINES: All you see is the head of
4 a large eight-inch bolt.

5 MR. SCHMITT: There are spots where -typically we would grade the soil back in a 6 shallower grade but there's spots on the site 7 where we can't do that based on the limits of the 8 9 edge of the property. So instead of having a 10 wall like this we would shave it back like this. 11 There's spots we can't go far enough back, so 12 we're going to put the Shotcrete and the soil nails on that part of the stabilization and then 13 14 slope it back afterwards. 15 MR. BROWNE: Thank you. 16 MR. VILLARI: I just want to address;

17John, you said you had a question you wanted18to --

MR. WARD: With Wappingers, what are your hours over there on Saturday?

21 MR. SCHMITT: We asked them to work a 22 handful of Saturdays to do some paving work. 23 That was three Saturdays back in July.

24 MR. WARD: What were their times?
25 MR. SCHMITT: It was 8 to -- I want to

NYC DEP 1 2 say 8 to 3:30. MR. WARD: Okay. Thank you. 3 MR. VILLARI: And I think, Pat, you 4 5 said you had some comments or questions as well? MR. HINES: No. I was just -- the 6 Shotcrete I knew was coming up. I've seen that 7 in the photos I was getting. 8 9 MR. SIMMONS: Oh, another issue. This 10 is just a hold over of old business. I do 11 believe, and Dan you can probably speak best to 12 this regarding the PRV vault location. We've 13 come to agreement with the Town to put it in the triangle off of Old Post Road. 14 15 MR. MICHAUD: Correct. Yes. Dan Michaud, for the record. I believe the resolution 16 17 came in from the Board recently, Jim Osborne and 18 the Town put that through, to accept an agreement with New York City to move the location of the 19 20 pressure reducing vault, which was supposed to be 21 at the corner of the water line we discussed 22 earlier at Poland Spring. We received a call 23 from Jim Osborne to consider moving it down the 24 road to a different location which would provide better ease of access for the Town staff, DPW 25

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2 staff who have to maintain and manage this piece 3 of infrastructure. It took a little bit of land acquisition and discussions to get there but I 4 5 think we finally got to the point where all are happy on our side and the Town's attorney, 6 7 et cetera. So at this point we're making plans to do that. I think we'll see that PRV vault be 8 9 put in, George, maybe this fall, or is that going 10 to be --11 MR. SCHMITT: Yeah. As soon as we get 12 the okay. MR. MICHAUD: That will be deeded or 13 14 dedicated to the Town once we put it in. We're 15 putting it in under the project cost similar to the water line. 16 17 MR. SCHMITT: The same installation is just being moved to a different location. Same 18 19 layout and everything. 20 MR. MICHAUD: The same hydraulic 21 concept. MR. VILLARI: I will take this visual 22 23 cue from Phil that we are going to give you guys a little insight into the Bell property and it's 24 25 potential future use.

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2 MR. SIMMONS: This is just a reminder 3 that we are working to purchase the Bell 4 property.

5 Currently -- just to give you some geography. 9W is here. This is the 5B site that 6 7 we already own. This is the developed property here that we're looking to purchase. We're doing 8 9 our due diligence. We're going through our 10 environmental site assessments, et cetera, making 11 certain that it's worthwhile to buy and what not. 12 We'll be in touch in the future with our final 13 decision and site plans, et cetera.

14 If you recall, what we're going to do 15 with the site is mainly use it to place excavated 16 material from the tunnel that we bring out from 17 the shaft, we'll transport it and mainly put it in this area. We'll also use the site for water 18 treatment. We'll have water treatment that --19 20 water that comes -- construction water that comes 21 from the tunnel, we'll treat it in settling ponds 22 as well as a treatment system here, similar to 23 what we already have, and we'll also use it for 24 storage. The segments that we will use to line the tunnel we'll store in this area as well. 25

NYC DEP 1 2 Anyway, all of that is under 3 development. Obviously if we more than double the size of the site we owe you a site plan 4 5 modification. CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Mike, would that 6 entail a new application? 7 MR. DONNELLY: I wouldn't think so. I 8 mean a separate one or an amended one? 9 10 MR. HINES: We have a 2013 number still 11 open, so --12 MR. SIMMONS: When we discussed it with 13 the consultants, I believe that was in March, we 14 looked at it as an amendment to the existing. We 15 would still have to do the same work anyway. If 16 you want a new one, that's fine. MR. DONNELLY: It's better to keep it 17 18 amended so we see the whole thing at once. MR. MICHAUD: I just want to add 19 20 something. The obvious benefit to doing this is 21 to keep the truck traffic off of Newburgh roads 22 and keep it interior to the site. 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2 way.

3 MR. HINES: While you have that map up, can you indicate where the Shotcrete was? I know 4 5 where it is. MR. SCHMITT: Basically as you come up 6 the hill here to about this point, we're pretty 7 much following the grade here. Once we get here, 8 9 basically this entire loop is all blasted out. 10 Anywhere from five feet to twenty plus feet below the grade here. So the inside -- this entire 11 12 area here, the part of the area back here, here and on the inside here, the rock was anywhere 13 from ten to twelve feet lower than what we 14 15 expected. MR. HINES: I wanted the Board to see 16 17 how far interior to the site it was. MR. SCHMITT: The area is like this. 18 19 We can't shave the hill back. 20 MR. HINES: We had that discussion 21 earlier. It's just a change of your methods to 22 stabilize it. 23 MR. SCHMITT: Exactly. The soil nail 24 is basically taking place. 25 MR. MICHAUD: The road sits down so

NYC DEP 1 it's cut in. When you look up there it's --2 MR. HINES: It's a canyon. 3 MR. SCHMITT: -- you can about see to 4 5 right here and that's about it. MR. MICHAUD: You'll get a tour. 6 7 MR. SCHMITT: Even the top here, because of the hillside, you're only seeing the 8 top of the hill. You're really not seeing 9 10 anything behind it. 11 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: Are you satisfied 12 with where you are at this point? MR. VILLARI: I think we are with the 13 14 exception of the problem with the crane, and so 15 our now need to extend the work hours to catch up 16 and make sure we stay on schedule. Otherwise, 17 yeah. MR. SCHMITT: Their production has been 18 very good. Because they lost the time -- we knew 19 20 from day one that the sinking of the shaft was on 21 a critical path of all the work, and we are 22 pushing them to keep on that schedule so we can 23 get the next phase ready to go. We want the next 24 contractor ready to get into that shaft and start with the tunnel as soon as the shaft is finished. 25

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2 So for us this is the driving part of this project is getting the shaft finished. 3 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: And the actual 4 5 tunnel you expect to begin on or about when? MR. SCHMITT: The procurement is going 6 7 to take us to probably the middle of next year. So we should have somebody on board with a 8 9 registered contract by the end of June next year. 10 Right now the deadline for the milestone for 11 finishing the shaft is the middle of April 2016. 12 So we are giving the tunnel contractor 13 approximately nine to ten months to procure a new 14 TBM so when he's ready to get into that shaft the 15 TBM will be close. Typically it's anywhere from 16 eight to twelve months if they are going to 17 procure a new machine, which is what we're 18 expecting at that point. 19 CHAIRMAN EWASUTYN: All right. Thank 20 you. 21 MR. VILLARI: Anything else? 22 MR. SIMMONS: That's it.
