WHEREAS, the Annual Budget and Special Assessment Roll for the said district were duly prepared and filed with the Town Clerk as required by law, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the said Budget and Assessment Roll as required by law, was held by this Town Board and the Board having met at the appointed time and place as specified in the Notice of Hearing duly published by the Town Clerk and all persons interested and desiring to be heard thereon having been heard; and

Consolidation Agreement') provides, inter alia that existing debt of the individual sewer districts, as defined by the Joint Consolidation Agreement, shall remain the responsibility of the owners of property and users who were responsible for such debt prior to consolidation, and they shall be assessed on a benefit basis for that debt service, and that future improvements of the new Consolidated Crossroads Sewer District encompassing all eight former sewer districts, which are financed, will be paid for by indebtedness of the consolidated district assessed and paid for on a benefit basis by all property owners and users of the Consolidated Crossroads Sewer District," and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Joint Consolidation Agreement, separate assessment rolls will be maintained for the areas of the former sewer districts within the new Consolidated Crossroads Sewer District, notwithstanding their consolidation and a new assessment roll will additionally be prepared for the Consolidated Crossroads Sewer District consisting of the combined assessment rolls of the eight former sewer districts; and

WHEREAS, certain of the former sewer districts had no debt upon consolidation and accordingly, maintenance of those old assessment rolls was discontinued or had not been previously prepared.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board of the Town of Newburgh does hereby adopt the budgets as compiled and presented at the said hearing, together with the Assessment Rolls accompanying the same to be entered in full in the minutes of the proceedings of this Town Board, the Benefit Formula and sum per unit to be apportioned and assessed according to the said roll for the benefit sewer districts in the Town of Newburgh set forth hereafter, as hereby adopted, being as follows:

1. Each single family residential building lot within the district as listed on the latest completed Assessment Roll shall be assigned 25 benefit units, except noncontiguous substandard lots which cannot be built upon because they do not meet the Town Municipal Code's requirements shall be assigned zero (0) benefit units. Each single family residential building lot with a residence thereon shall be assigned 25 additional benefit units, except for such building lots whose boundaries or the residence thereon are more than 500 feet from a sewer main or lateral which is existing or the installation of which has been finally approved by the Town pursuant to the appropriate procedures. In such instances those lots, unless actually connected to the sewer system, shall be assigned 3 benefit units

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and each such lot containing a residence shall be assigned 3 additional benefit units for each residence, with excess bulk area of each such lot containing a residence to be assigned an additional 3 benefit units per acre.

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Two family residential building lots with such buildings thereon shall be assigned 25 benefit units for the lot, plus 25 benefit units for each of the residences thereon, except for such building lots whose boundaries or the residence thereon are more than 500 feet from a sewer main or lateral which is existing or the installation of which has been finally approved by the Town pursuant to the appropriate procedures. In such instances those lots unless actually connected to the sewer system, shall be assigned 3 benefit units for the lot, plus 3 benefit units for each residence, with excess bulk area of each such lot containing a residence to be assigned an additional 3 benefit units per acre.

Undeveloped bulk land parcels shall be assigned 25 benefit units per acre, except in the event the land cannot be developed due to its being part of a clustered development, where the land has been used to satisfy zoning area requirements for developed parcels and is titled in a homeowners association or similar entity, and is subject to an irrevocable conservation easement or similar restriction which prohibits its development, then it shall be assigned 0 benefit units. For purposes herein, a cluster development shall be defined as a tract in which common open space has been gained by use of lot dimensions smaller than the minimums required by the bulk regulations for the zoning district in which the tract is located, as authorized under Section 281 of the Town Law

Developed commercial/industrial parcels shall be assigned a base charge of 50 benefit units plus 25 units per acre plus one of the following assignments based upon estimated volume of sewage discharge:

Heavy user30 units per 1,000 sq. ft. of structureAverage user20 units per 1,000 sq. ft. of structureLow user10 units per 1,000 sq. ft. of structure

- Trailer Parks shall be assigned a base charge of 50 units plus 25 units per pad plus 25 units per acre.
 - Developed commercial/industrial with residence parcels shall be assigned

a base charge of 50 units for each residence plus 25 units per acre plus

one of the assessments based upon estimated volume of sewage

discharge above.

Apartments and condominiums shall be assigned a base charge of 50 units plus 50 units per apartment or unit plus 25 units per acre.

Motels shall be assigned a base charge of 50 units plus 25 units per acre plus one of the assignments based upon estimated volume of sewage discharge above.

The term "residential building lot" shall mean any parcel of land identified on the Orange County tax map by Section, Block and Lot number, occupied, unoccupied or to be occupied by a building and its accessory buildings, together with such open spaces as are required under the provisions of Chapter 185 entitled "Zoning" of Code of the Town of Newburgh, containing, when vacant, not less than the minimum area and dimensions required by Chapter 185 for a lot in the Zoning District in which such land is situated so as to be adequate as a condition to the issuance of a building permit for a building on such land. In the event an individual, tax map parcel is not so adequate, but is contiguous to another inadequate tax map parcel or parcel in the same ownership, and the parcels together contain not less than the minimum area and dimensions required so as to be so adequate, then the combined tax map parcels shall be considered one building lot for purposes of the benefit formula, and be it

Crossroads Consolidated	Usage Charge (\$/1000gal)	\$6.94

The following minimum operating and maintenance charge shall apply to all connected properties, including but not limited to those without water meters:

\$36.00 per quarter; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the single rate charged quarterly to the Roseton Hills Sewer District will be as follows:

\$162.50 per residential dwelling unit per quarter

Enclosed please find for the Town Board's consideration the above referenced Introductory Local Law amending the definitions of "Annual Income" for both "senior" and "persons with a disability" property tax exemptions to conform to the recently amended State statute. For most municipalities, including the Town, the annual income now looked at in determining qualification and percentage level of the exemptions will be the second latest preceding year rather than the year immediately preceding the date of the exemption application. Additionally, the Local Law explicitly excludes veteran's disability compensation received from the VA from the calculation of income and the annual income definition for the disability exemption will conform to the senior exemption.

INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. _ OF THE YEAR 2023 AMENDING SECTIONS 166-4 AND 166-18 OF CHAPTER 166 ENTITLED "TAXATION" OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF NEWBURGH: DEFINITIONS OF ANNUAL INCOME FOR EXEMPTIONS FOR PERSONS SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE OR OVER AND FOR PERSONS WITH A DISABILITY

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh as follows:

SECTION 1 - TITLE

This Local Law shall be referred to as "A Local Law Amending Sections 166-4 and 166-18 of Chapter 166 entitled 'Taxation' of the Municipal Code of the Town of Newburgh: Definitions of Annual Income for Exemptions for Persons Sixty-Five Years of Age or Over and for Persons with a Disability".

SECTION 2 - AMENDMENT TO SECTION 166-4

The definition of "Annual Income" in Section 166-4 "Definitions" of Chapter 166 entitled "Taxation" of the Code of the Town of Newburgh is hereby amended to read as follows:

"ANNUAL INCOME

The income of the owner or combined income of the owners of the property for the <u>second latest</u> income tax year immediately preceding the date of making application for exemption. Any such income shall be offset by all medical and prescription drug expenses actually paid which were not reimbursed or paid for by insurance. <u>Veteran's disability compensation as defined in Title 38 of the United States Code shall be excluded from the computation of income.</u>"

SECTION 3 – AMENDMENT TO SECTION 166-18

The definition of "Annual Income" in Section 166-18 "Definitions" of Chapter 166 entitled "Taxation" of the Code of the Town of Newburgh is hereby amended to read as follows:

"ANNUAL INCOME

In accordance with § 459-c of the Real Property Tax Law, the income of the owner or combined income of the owners of the property for the <u>second latest</u> income tax year immediately preceding the date of making application for exemption. Any such income shall be offset by all medical and prescription drug expenses actually paid which were not reimbursed or paid for by insurance. Veteran's disability compensation as defined in Title 38 of the United States Code shall be excluded from the computation of income."

SECTION 4 - NO RETROACTIVE EFFECT

The annual income limits for exemptions for persons 65 years and older and persons with a disability which are increased by the amendments contained in Sections 2 and 3 above shall apply to assessed valuations for the March 1, 2024 taxable status date and thereafter. The amendment shall not apply retroactively.

SECTION 5 - VALIDITY

The invalidity of any provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Local Law that can be given effect without such invalid provision.

SECTION 6 - EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect immediately when it is filed in the Office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Stewart Jones, Hacker Murphy regarding the above referenced proposed settlement, a proposed Settlement Agreement and Judgment and Order and charts showing the approximate claimed refund amounts and the approximate refunds that will be due from the taxing jurisdictions under the proposed settlement of the above referenced real property tax assessment appeal. Also enclosed is a map showing the location of the tax parcel which is the subject of the proceedings which contains a bank.

The settlement provides for a reduction in assessed value of \$62,750 from \$495,000 to \$432,250 for 2022 and a reduction of assessed value of \$117,175 from \$495,000 to \$377,825 for 2023. Attorney Drobny in her letter advises that the provisions of RPTL Section 727 will apply, holding the Assessed Value at \$377,825 for the 2024, 2025 and 2026 assessment rolls, subject to the statutory exceptions.

The chart indicates that the refund liability for the Town (including Highway but not including special districts and the Fire District) will be approximately \$2,800.32 versus claimed refund liability of approximately \$11,604.95. Cronomer Fire District will have a refund liability of approximately \$853.21. Newburgh Enlarged City School District's attorneys will also be signing the Settlement Agreement.

Also attached is a proposed resolution which would authorize the Settlement.

Attached please find the proposed Consent Judgment relative to the above-referenced proceedings. There are currently two years pending (2022 and 2023).

The subject parcel is the M&T branch bank located at 5075 Route 9W, Tax Map #79-3-20 (AV \$495,000). The FMV is \$2,004,049 in 2022 and \$2,292,700 in 2023. After review of the petitioner's pro forma, the subject property and comparable properties, this settlement was negotiated.

The FMV is reduced to \$1,750,000 in 2022 and 2023 (reduction of \$62,750 AV in 2022 and reduction of \$117,175 AV in 2023). The 2023 assessment will be held for 2024, 2025 and 2026 pursuant to RPTL \$727, subject to the statutory exceptions. After considering the costs of trial-ready appraisals and litigation, we feel that this is a good settlement.

I have attached for your review a copy of the refund liability charts, which show the potential liability versus the proposed settlement refund liability.

We recommend that the Town Board authorize us to enter into this settlement as proposed. Please place this matter on the agenda for the next Newburgh Town Board meeting for approval. Once the Resolution passes, please let me know and I will sign the Order.

2. It is further specifically agreed by and between the parties that the provisions of RPTL §727 will apply to this proceeding.

3. That each and every taxing entity levying and collecting taxes upon the basis of the 2022 and 2023 assessment rolls are directed to make changes to correct said assessments pursuant to the terms of the Settlement Agreement, and pay refunds based on the difference between the taxes collected on the original assessments and the taxes that would have been due pursuant to the revised assessments.

4. The parties agree that this Settlement Agreement is in their best interest, and that it is made only for the purpose of resolving pending litigation in order to avoid the expenses incident to such litigation and for such other reasons as the parties deem material. In no event shall the Settlement Agreement, or the contents thereof, be offered to or admitted in these proceedings if prosecution thereof is carried forward, or in any other proceeding by the parties or third parties, as competent evidence of any fact.

5. The parties agree that the 2022 and 2023 pending proceedings shall be discontinued, and that a Judgment and Order incorporating the terms of this Settlement Agreement may be entered.

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT is made this _____ day of August, 2022 to a certain Outside User Agreement dated May 31, 2007 (the "OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT") by and between the TOWN OF NEWBURGH, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, with principal offices located at 1496 Route 300, Newburgh, New York, 12550, for and on behalf of the CROSSROADS SEWER DISTRICT and GIDNEY SEWER DISTRICT, together now known as the CROSSROADS CONSOLIDATED SEWER DISTRICT (hereinafter the "TOWN"), and ELM FARM ESTATES LLC, a New York Limited Liability Company qualified to do business in New York State, having an address at 9 Meron Drive #303, Monroe, New York, 10950 (hereinafter the "OUTSIDE USER").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the TOWN and the OUTSIDE USER entered into the OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT pursuant to which the TOWN agreed to provide sewer service to a 54 lot single family residential subdivision of real property in the Town of Newburgh, County of Orange, State of New York, consisting of approximately ± 45.1 acres and shown on the Tax Map as Section 39, Block 1, Lot 12.44, (the "PREMISES") described in greater detail on a subdivision plan dated September 20, 2002 (the "PROJECT"), 43 of said lots being situated outside the boundaries of any TOWN sewer district, pursuant to the terms and conditions of said agreement, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT, the OUTSIDE USER paid to the Town the sum of TWENTY ONE THOUSAND (\$21,000.00) upon execution for the Gidney Sewer District as the first installment of the fee payable to the TOWN

pursuant to said agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Crossroads Sewer District and Gidney Sewer District, together with other sewer districts of the TOWN, have subsequently been consolidated by the TOWN into the CROSSROADS CONSOLIDATED SEWER DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, the Outside Sewer Agreement was subject to and contingent upon the OUTSIDE USER commencing construction of the required sewer facilities within three (3) years of the date of the Outside User Agreement (the "TERM") subject to an extension for one (1) additional year after which the TOWN has the authority, in its sole discretion, to cancel the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the OUTSIDE USER submitted updated plans for the PROJECT in 2021 and the Planning Board acting as lead agency adopted a Negative Declaration under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") on November 4, 2021 for the PROJECT and granted preliminary and final subdivision approval of a subdivision plan dated February 11, 2015 for the PROJECT on April 7, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to amend the Outside User Agreement in order to extend the Term and to address the consolidation of the sewer districts.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the provisions set forth herein, the TOWN and the OUTSIDE USER agree as follows:

1. The TERM for the OUTSIDE USER to commence construction of the required sewer facilities is hereby extended for a period which ends one (1) year from the date of this Amendment. If construction of the sewer facilities is not commenced within the extension of the TERM provided for herein or any permitted extension thereof, the TOWN has the authority, in its sole discretion, to cancel this Agreement.
2. Wherever the terms "Gidney Sewer District" or "GIDNEY" and "Crossroads Sewer District" or "CROSSROADS" appear in the OUTSIDE USER AGREMENT, the term "CROSSROADS CONSOLIDATED SEWER DISTRICT" shall be substituted, reflecting the consolidation of those sewer districts and others pursuant to proceedings heretofore had and taken by the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh in accordance with the provisions of Section 751 of the General Municipal Law, into a single sewer district known as the Crossroads Consolidated Sewer District and in accordance with the terms and conditions of the certain JOINT CONSOLIDATION AGREEMENT PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 17-A OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPALLAWOFTHESTATEOFNEWYORK dated November 8, 2016.

3. Upon the execution of this First Amendment by all parties, an original shall be recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Orange to provide notice of the terms and provisions of the Agreement as Amended to all subsequent owners of all or any portion of the PREMISES. OUTSIDE USER shall execute or cause the owner of the PREMISES to execute, as the case may be, and deliver all additional documents required for the recording of this First Amendment. OUTSIDE USER shall pay or reimburse the recording costs.

4. All the terms and conditions of the OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT except as otherwise stated herein shall remain in full force and effect. Capitalized terms used herein shall have the same definition as in the OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT, unless the context otherwise requires. This First Amendment along with the OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT previously executed by the parties constitutes the entire agreement between the OUTSIDE USER and the TOWN with respect to the subject matter hereof and together supersedes all prior written or oral understandings, agreements, or representations from one party to the other. This First Amendment and the OUTSIDE USER AGREEMENT may not be further modified or extended orally.

GIDNEY SEWER DISTRICT IN TOWN OF NEWBURGH

AGREEMENT made this 3^{1} 5^{1} day of May, 2007, by and between the TOWN OF NEWBURGH, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, with principal offices located at 1496 Route 300, Newburgh, New York, 12550, for an on behalf of the CROSSROADS SEWER DISTRICT AND THE GIDNEY SEWER DISTRICT (hereinafter the "TOWN"), and ELM FARM ASSOCIATES LLC, a New York Limited Liability Company qualified to do business in New York State, having an address at 8 Overdell Lane, Newburgh, New York, 12550 (hereinafter the "OUTSIDE USER").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the OUTSIDE USER is the owner of real property in the Town of Newburgh, County of Orange, State of New York, consisting of approximately ± 45.1 acres and shown on the Tax Map as Section 39, Block 1, Lot 12.44, (the "PREMISES"), and

WHEREAS, the PREMISES have received preliminary subdivision approval from the Town of Newburgh Planning Board (the "PLANNING BOARD") for a 54 lot single family residential subdivision described in greater detail on a subdivision plan dated September 20, 2002 (the "PROJECT"), 43 of said lots being situated outside the boundaries of any TOWN sewer district, and

WHEREAS, the TOWN has agreed to provide sewer service to the PROJECT provided the OUTSIDE USER installs all required sewer facilities to bring sewer service for the PROJECT from the sewer main located in Tamarack Drive, as well as all necessary facilities within the PROJECT, all such installations to be at no cost to the TOWN and in accordance with all applicable governmental regulations, and

WHEREAS, OUTSIDE USER shall pay to the TOWN (i) the sum of ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY NINE THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$189,000.00) DOLLARS for and on behalf of the Crossroads Sewer District; and (ii) the sum of TWENTY ONE THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$21,000.00) DOLLARS for and on behalf of the Gidney Sewer District, for a total payment of TWO HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND (\$210,000.00) DOLLARS; as consideration for the TOWN entering into this agreement to provide sewer service, the precise amount of the payment and the payment terms set forth hereinafter in this agreement, and

WHEREAS, the OUTSIDE USER indicates its consent to the provisions contained herein by execution of this agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the provisions set forth herein, the TOWN and the OUTSIDE USER agree as follows:

1. The TOWN, subject to the notice, permitting and other applicable provisions of the TOWN agreement with the City of Newburgh dated May 6, 2004, and all necessary federal, state and county regulations and approvals, agrees to provide sewer service to the PROJECT provided that the OUTSIDE USER brings the required sewer facilities from the PROJECT to a location designated by the TOWN, and further provided that the OUTSIDE USER installs all other required facilities necessary so that the TOWN can accept the sewerage flow from the PREMISES and PROJECT, all at the sole cost and expense of the OUTSIDE USER. All such installations shall be made in accordance with all applicable state, county and TOWN requirements and shall be acceptable to the TOWN'S Town Engineer. The OUTSIDE USER

agrees to provide the TOWN with a certification from a New York State licensed professional engineer acceptable to the TOWN, certifying to the TOWN that the installation of the sewerage facilities is in accordance with all applicable state, county and TOWN requirements. THE OUTSIDE USER agrees further to provide the TOWN with three sets of "as built" plans for the sewer system, in form acceptable to the TOWN Engineer, as installed by the OUTSIDE USER. Final acceptance by the TOWN of the sewerage facilities shall not relieve the OUTSIDE USER from responsibility for any defects in design, materials or workmanship.

2. The OUTSIDE USER agrees that it shall use the connection to the TOWN'S sewer system solely for the disposal of sanitary sewage. The OUTSIDE USER further agrees that it shall comply with all laws, rules and regulations governing use of TOWN sewers, including but not limited to those laws, rules and regulations contained in the TOWN'S Code.

3. The OUTSIDE USER agrees to pay to the TOWN (i) on behalf of the Crossroads Sewer District in consideration of this Agreement the sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars AND NO/100 (\$4,500.00) DOLLARS and (ii) on behalf of the Gidney Sewer District in consideration of this Agreement the sum of Five Hundred Dollars AND NO/100 (\$500.00) DOLLARS, equaling a total of Five Thousand and N0/100 (\$5,000,00) Dollars for each single family residential lot minus one within the PROJECT and outside the boundaries of a sewer district, as approved by the TOWN Planning Board on a final subdivision plat filed in the Orange County Clerk's Office. Payment is to be made in accordance with the following schedule.

(A) Five Hundred Dollars AND NO/100 (\$500.00) per single family residential lot minus one for the Gidney Sewer District upon the execution of this agreement, and;

(B)

Five Hundred Dollars AND NO/100 (\$500.00) per single family residential lot

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minus one lot for the Crossroads Sewer District upon Final Subdivision Approval, which is the date that the Chairman of the Planning Board will execute the Final Subdivision Plat, and;

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(B) Four Thousand Dollars AND NO/100 (\$4,000.00) DOLLARS per single family residential lot minus one on the final site plan or final subdivision plat shall be paid to the TOWN upon the issuance of a building permit for construction of a building containing a dwelling in the PROJECT on each single family residential lot minus one outside the boundaries of a sewer district, for the Crossroads Sewer District

4. Upon the execution of this Agreement by all parties, an original shall be recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Orange to provide notice of the terms and provisions of this Agreement to all subsequent owners of all or any portion of the PREMISES. OUTSIDE USER shall execute or cause the owner of the PREMISES to execute, as the case may be, and deliver all additional documents required for the recording of this Agreement. OUTSIDE USER shall pay or reimburse the recording costs.

5. This Agreement is subject to and contingent upon the OUTSIDE USER commencing construction of the required sewer facilities within three (3) years of the date of this Agreement (the "TERM"), which TERM shall be automatically extended for one (1) additional year if in the sole discretion of the TOWN, the OUTSIDE USER is pursuing the PROJECT diligently. If construction of the sewer facilities is not commenced within the TERM or any permitted extension thereof, the TOWN has the authority, in its sole discretion, to cancel this Agreement.

6. The OUTSIDE USER agrees that in the event that the OUTSIDE USER, or OUTSIDE USER'S contractor, causes any damage to the sewer lines, facilities or property of the TOWN arising during OUTSIDE USER'S connection to the TOWN'S sewer system that OUTSIDE

USER will indemnify, save, and hold the TOWN harmless and pay any damages that arise to the TOWN'S facilities during the hookup including all expenses that may be incurred in enforcing this Agreement, such as but not limited to reasonable fees of the TOWN'S attorney and court costs. OUTSIDE USER further agrees that before it enters into any agreement with a contractor with respect to such hookup work that it shall require the contractor to provide the TOWN with a certificate of insurance running to the TOWN providing for payment for any damages arising to the TOWN'S facilities, including but not limited to reasonable counsel fees.

7. The OUTSIDE USER agrees to pay such fees, charges and rents for sewer service including, but not limited to, bonding charges for capital improvements and operation and maintenance charges or sewer rents, as the TOWN may charge provided that said fees and charges are determined on the same basis and are at the same rate as users within the Town and the Gidney Sewer District (hereinafter "GIDNEY"). The TOWN will forward bills to the OUTSIDE USER, its successors or assigns according to the same schedule as other users receiving service from GIDNEY. The OUTSIDE USER agrees to pay all charges in accordance with the payment schedule set forth on said bill.

8. If OUTSIDE USER, or any subsequent owner of all or any portion of the PREMISES or PROJECT, shall default in the obligation to pay any of the charges set forth in the Agreement and does not cure such default within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice of such default, a lien therefore shall attach to the OUTSIDE USER'S or subsequent owner's property within the PREMISES or PROJECT effective on recording of notice thereof in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Orange. Such lien shall be superior and prior in time to all liens recorded subsequent to recordation of this Agreement as if any such lien had been recorded concurrently

with this Agreement. In the event those charges are not paid within ten (10) days after the receipt of written notice of default, all rights of the OUTSIDE USER, its heirs, successors or assigns or subsequent owners to receive sewer service under this Agreement shall cease and the TOWN reserves the right, in addition to other remedies provided for herein, to immediately discontinue the service. TOWN officials thereupon shall have the authority to enter upon the PREMISES or dwelling unit in order to disconnect and block off the service connection, and the OUTSIDE USER acknowledges and agrees that such disconnection and discontinuance of service shall not constitute a sewer or public health emergency. The TOWN may, as its option, enter unpaid operation and maintenance charges, sewer rents and special assessments upon the property tax bill for the PREMISES, and each unit therein.

9. The TOWN shall have and OUTSIDE USER hereby expressly grant to it, all legal and equitable remedies now or hereafter available to such a municipality against the property and the owners thereof who shall default in the payment of any tax, service charge or assessment payable to it, to the same extent and with the same effect as such legal and equitable remedies could be asserted and pursued by the municipality against OUTSIDE USER were the PREMISES located within GIDNEY or any extension thereto.

10. Upon completion of the sewer facilities, the OUTSIDE USER shall offer and the TOWN will accept dedication of only such sewer facilities installed by the OUTSIDE USER as the TOWN'S Board in its sole discretion determines serve and benefit Crossroads Sewer District and/or the GIDNEY Sewer District. Such offer shall be for nominal consideration and shall be in a form acceptable to the TOWN'S attorney. Simultaneously with said offer the OUTSIDE USER shall execute and deliver to the TOWN or cause to be executed and delivered all utility

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easements running to the TOWN in a form acceptable to the TOWN'S attorney, having a width of not less than twenty (20) feet for the reconstruction, repair, replacement, maintenance, operation and removal of the sewer facilities and appropriate recording documents as required by the Orange County Clerk. OUTSIDE USER, its successors and assigns shall repair and maintain all facilities that it installs which are not accepted for dedication by the TOWN. In the event a repair or maintenance activity shall, in the sole judgment of the Town, be immediately necessary to protect the TOWN'S sewer system or the public health and safety, however, the Town shall notify the OUTSIDE USER in writing and the OUTSIDE USER shall complete the repairs or maintenance within twenty four (24) hours of receipt of said notice. OUTSIDE USER'S refusal to accept delivery of said notice shall be deemed constructive receipt of same. In the event the OUTSIDE USER fails to complete the repairs or maintenance within the twenty four (24) hour period, the TOWN shall have the right to enter the PREMISES and complete same at the OUTSIDE USER'S sole expense. The Town will present a statement of the costs of the repairs and maintenance within thirty (30) days of completion of same. The OUTSIDE USER shall forward payment within ten (10) days of the receipt of the statement. The OUTSIDE USER shall reimburse all expenses that may be incurred in enforcing this Agreement, such as but not limited to reasonable fees of the TOWN'S attorney and court costs.

11. This Agreement pertains solely to sewer service to the PROJECT, not to exceed Forty Three (43) Units, as approved by the PLANNING BOARD and shall not be construed to grant any entitlement to sewer service to any addition or expansion to such PROJECT on the PREMISES or any other project or facility constructed or installed on the PREMISES.

12. The OUTSIDE USER agrees to submit to the TOWN prior to the issuance of the first

building permit for the PROJECT a map, plan and report prepared by a New York State licensed Professional Engineer for a sewer district extension for the PREMISES served by the installed facilities. If requested by the TOWN, the OUTSIDE USER for itself, its successors and assigns, agrees to duly execute and deliver a petition for the extension of GIDNEYTOWN to include the PREMISES. The OUTSIDE USER acknowledges and agrees that the TOWN shall determine in its sole discretion, when, if ever, it is appropriate to proceed with the district extension.

13. The TOWN'S agreement to provide sewer service is subject to the availability of treatment capacity at the time of actual connection of buildings in the PROJECT. Nothing herein contained shall assure availability of treatment capacity at the City of Newburgh's sewage treatment plants for treatment of the PROJECT'S sewage. The permitting of OUTSIDE USER to connect to the GIDNEYTOWN Sewer District facilities is predicated upon and subject to capacity at the sewage treatment plant in excess of that required by users within the TOWN'S sewer districts at the time of connection; and such permits and approvals as are required by the City of Newburgh, agencies of Orange County and New York State for the granting of connection permits to the premises by the TOWN, such permits and approvals being the sole responsibility of OUTSIDE USER to obtain at its expense. OUTSIDE USER agrees to hold the TOWN harmless from claims arising from any absence of treatment capacity for the PROJECT'S sewage. The TOWN represents that it has approved and is presently undertaking a two million (2,000,000) gallon per day expansion to the City of Newburgh's sewage treatment plant and the TOWN is entitled to use one million eight hundred thousand (1,800,000) gallons per day of such expanded capacity pursuant to the May 6, 2004 agreement between the TOWN and City. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to afford the OUTSIDE USER

the right to compel the TOWN to enforce its agreement with the City of Newburgh.

14. Any and all notices shall be addressed to the parties at the address set forth in the beginning of this Agreement or to such other address as may hereinafter be designed in writing by either party to the other.

15. No waiver of any breach of any condition of this Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the party waiving said breach. No such waiver shall in any way affect any other term or condition of this Agreement or constitute a cause or excuse for a repetition of such or any other breach unless the waiver shall include the same.

16. This Agreement is in addition to and not in limitation of any other rights and remedies the TOWN may have by virtue of any other instrument, by law or otherwise. This Agreement is executed in, and shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.

17. This Agreement and its amendments may be executed in multiple counterparts, with each counterpart to be deemed an original, but all multiple copies together constituting one and the same instrument.

18. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision(s) of this Agreement will not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision(s).

19. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

WHEREAS, the OWNER is the owner, in fee, of premises located in the Town of Newburgh, County of Orange, State of New York, being shown and designated as Lots No. 30, 31, 43, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55 and 56 identified on a Map entitled "Subdivision Plan for Elm Farm Subdivision" dated _______ and recorded in the Orange County Clerks office on _______, 2023 as Filed Map No. ______(the "Subdivision"). Being and intended to be the same premises conveyed to the Declarant herein by a Deed dated _______ and recorded in the Orange County Clerk's office on _______ in Liber ______ at Page ______(Each such lot hereinafter referred to as a "Lot" and collectively as the "Lots"). Those properties being further identified as having the following Section, Block and Lot numbers on the Tax Map of the Town of Newburgh:

WHEREAS, the Lots are approved to be improved by single family residences and related accessory structures; and

WHEREAS, in order to address traffic safety concerns, the Town's Planning Board required that the Owner guarantee and install a street light and the necessary approved connection to the electrical grid for the street light to receive electrical power on an existing utility pole on Wells Road, an existing Town street, near the intersection with the Subdivision's entry street known as "Black Gum Court", a street irrevocably offered to be dedicated to the Town (hereinafter the "Street Light"): and

WHEREAS, both the Street Light location and the Lots are outside the boundaries of any established Town Lighting District; and

WHEREAS, the Street Light will be connected to the electrical power system of Central Hudson Gas & Electric ("Central Hudson"), which has informed the Town and Owner that is will only deliver power to and maintain street lights on Town roads under the Town's account and not to any private account; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to address the provision and expense of electrical power, maintenance, repair and replacement of the Street Light following its installation by the Owner.

WHEREAS, the Owner wishes to create covenants, restrictions and/or reservations, to forever run with the above referenced Lots.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PROVISIONS SET FORTH HEREIN, IT IS HEREBY AGREED as follows and , that the following covenants, restrictions and reservations shall hereafter affect the above-referenced premises:

> The Owner agrees upon satisfactory completion of the installation of the Street Light, to transfer to the TOWN, by bill of sale or other instrument acceptable to the Town, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances of any kind, all of the Owner's right, title and interest in the Street Light.

- 2. The Owner agrees to pay to the Town upon connection of the Street Light an annual charge equal to the aggregate yearly charges by Central Hudson, or any successor power company, providing service for street lights, to the Town, during the prior year for one street light of the same or similar kind including electricity and delivery charges, plus the costs of any maintenance, repairs or replacement of the Street Light incurred by the Town. Such charge shall be payable on or before the 30th of January of each year. The charge shall be pro-rated in equal proportions over the ten (10) Lots, so that the Owner of each Lot shall be annually billed and pay ten (10%) percent of the total charge. The Town reserves the right to add the costs of postage for annual bills and notices to the charges on each such bill. Late payments shall be subject to a \$5.00 penalty.
- 3. Upon the execution of this Agreement by the parties, an original shall be recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Orange to provide notice of the terms and provisions of this Agreement to all subsequent owners of all or any of the Lots.
- 4. If the Owner, or any subsequent owner of all or any of the Lots, shall default in the obligation to pay any of the charges set forth in this Agreement and does not cure such default within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice of such default, a lien therefore shall attach to the such owner's Lot or Lots within the Subdivision, effective on recording of notice thereof in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Orange. Such lien shall be superior and prior in time to all liens recorded subsequent to recordation of this Agreement as if any such lien had been recorded concurrently with this Agreement.

- 5. The TOWN shall have and Owner hereby expressly grants to it, all legal and equitable remedies now or hereafter available to such a municipality against the property and the owners thereof. If any action at law or in equity is necessary to enforce the terms of this Agreement, the Town shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees, costs and necessary disbursements in addition to any other relief to which it may be entitled.
- 6. All rights, title and privileges herein granted, including all benefits and burdens, shall run with the land and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, assigns and legal representatives.
- 7. Every notice, demand, consent, request, approval or other document or instrument ("Notice") required or permitted to be served upon any of the parties hereto shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly served, if personally delivered or if mailed by first class mail on the date of mailing (it being agreed, however, that, except in an emergency, the time period in which a response must be given to any such notice shall commence to run on the date on which the addressee thereof has received or has refused to receive the same).

2. That Elm Farm acknowledges that drainage/storm waters from the said road discharge into the drainage facilities and the Town shall have such rights as are necessary to continue such discharge following acceptance of said roads as Town roads.

3. That the Town shall have the right to enforce this agreement to the same extent as the Town could otherwise enforce or enjoin violations of law, permits or approvals.
