PROJECT NARRATIVE

The subject parcels are located on a 0.97 of an acre tract, owned by the applicant Carol Lee Sager, on the southerly side of Little Britain Road approximately 480 feet east of the intersection of Little Britain Road (aka NYS Route 207) with Old Little Britain Road. Located in a Residential/Office Overlay District (R3/O) Zoning District, the parcels are Lot No. 1 and Lot No. 2 of the Dorothy Taylor Subdivision, Orange County Filed Map No. 7758. The applicant proposes relocating the division line between her 2 parcels so that the existing pool, is on Lot 1 (SBL: 97-1-35.1). 
