On January 16, 2014 the above referenced project received conceptual approval from the Planning Board for 90 non-senior townhomes and 30 senior citizen apartments. The Planning Board sent the attached letter to the Town Board recommending authorization to review the project under the gross density provision of Section 185-48(B).

Subsequently, the project was revised to consist of 108 non-senior apartments and 36 senior citizen apartments. This plan was presented to the Planning Board September 17, 2015 and received conceptual approval.

The applicant would like to appear before the Town Board to request the Board authorize the Planning Board to review the project under the gross density provisions of Section 185-48.B.4. For projects consisting of a mix on non-senior and senior multiple dwelling units, this section allows a density of 9 units per usable acre as long as 1/3 of the bonus units are devoted to senior citizen housing. There are 16 useable acres on the site. A density of 9 units per useable acre permits a maximum unit count of 144 units. For the proposed project, 16 senior citizen dwelling units would be required. The project proposes 36 senior citizen dwelling units.

Chazen proposes to perform a Phase I ESA of the site in accordance with the scope and limitations set forth in the ASTM Practice E 1527-13 (Phase I ESA Process). The purpose of a Phase I ESA is to identify recognized environmental conditions (RECs) or Significant Data Gaps (SDGs) on a property through review of historical site uses, interviews with parties knowledgeable about the site, observations made during a

site visit, and review of federal and state databases.

Under ASTM E 1527-13 Standard Practice, a REC means the presence or likely presence of any hazardous substances or petroleum products in, on, or at a property: (1) due to any release to the environment; (2) under conditions indicative of a release to the environment; or (3) under conditions that pose a material threat of a future release to the environment.

The 2013 revisions to the ASTM Phase I ESA guidance standard require that vapor migration be more formally assessed referencing ASTM Standard (2010 ASTM E2600-10). Therefore, the Phase I ESA will include a Tier 1 vapor encroachment screening consistent with the 2010 ASTM E2600-10: *Standard Guide for Vapor Encroachment Screening on a Property Involved in Real Estate Transactions.* Vapors can come from contaminants on the site or from contaminant plumes flowing under the site from adjacent properties.

Report Preparation

Chazen will prepare a report of the findings generated during the Phase I ESA. The report will include figures of the site area including a USGS topographical map, tax map and aerial photograph, and relevant photographs obtained during the site visit. The Radioactive Materials Licensing program of the New York State Department of Health (DOH) Bureau of Environmental Radiation Protection is responsible for licensing and inspecting radioactive materials licensees including commercial, medical, academic and government facilities.

The DOH has a license termination program that requires the disclosure of radioactive materials storage and disposal. Applicants for license termination must certify that all radioactive materials have been removed from the property and properly managed. If the property owner is not able to provide the license termination and inspection documentation, Chazen will submit a Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) request to the DOH for this information. Chazen will review available DOH records to assess whether appropriate license termination documentation procedures have been completed and/or assess if the former operations have apparent outstanding non-compliance issues.

According to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), once site operations cease, there would be no remnant unless there was undisclosed inappropriate handling/disposal. Therefore, we do not expect a REC to be identified relative to radiation activities.

Results of this research would be included in the Phase I ESA, as an out-of-scope item.

Attached for the Town Board's review and approval is a proposal for design engineering services from Maser Consulting dated 17 December 2015, revised 13 January 2016. The proposal delineates the locations in Colden Park targeted for either water main replacement or installation of new water main to eliminate dead ends. The engineering services are structured to accomplish two goals. Firstly, to obtain OCDOH approval for all of the proposed work. Second, to allow the Town to bid Phase 1 – the water main replacement in Arbor Drive through Mimosa Place.

Based on the above, approval of Phase 1.0, 2.0, 3.0 and 5.0 is recommended at this time at a not-to-exceed cost of \$31,550. Phase 6.0 and 7.0 will only be used if necessary and a request for approval will be made separately.

Maser Consulting P.A. is pleased to submit this proposal to provide professional services for the proposed replacement of the existing watermain, valves, hydrants, services and appurtenances with a new eight (8) inch watermain for the Town of Newburgh. We propose to Obtain Health Department Approval for the entire project, and prepare bid documents only for the portion from the connection at the intersection of Route 17K and Arbor Drive to Windwood Drive through Mimosa Place to Flamingo Drive. It is our understanding that the other replacement sections will be constructed via Town forces. The replacements are to be designed and permitted as described below.

On November 19, 2015 Joe Dopico and Andrew Fetherston from Maser Consulting met with Jim Osborn and John Platt from the Town of Newburgh to discuss the Colden Park water main replacement project. We marked up the survey drawings that were prepared by Maser Consulting to show the location of the new relocated 8 inch ductile iron watermain. We discussed many specifics regarding replacement of services, placement of valves, installation of additional fire hydrants at a maximum of 500 feet separation, providing separation distance from the new watermain and the existing sewer line and the replacement of the water and sewer services to the residences. Wherever sanitary services are encountered in performing this work, that sewer service shall be replaced with 4 inch PVC SDR 35 pipe.

On our Sheet 3 of 3 survey, the work commences at the intersection of Route 17K and Arbor Drive where the existing 12 inch CIP Watermain transitions to a six-inch transite pipe as it proceeds south on Arbor Drive. It is proposed to construct a new <u>600 foot long</u>, 8 inch ductile iron watermain on the east side of Arbor Drive. At the intersection of Windwood/Westwood

Drive, it is proposed to construct a new 260 foot long, 8 inch ductile iron watermain on the north side of Westwood Drive.

The intersection of New York State to 17K and Arbor Drive and the intersection of Arbor Drive and Windwood Drive / Mimosa Place require a blowup plan to provide adequate detail for the connections.

Sheet 2 is the continuation of the work where the new 8" DIP watermain is to connect at the intersection of Mimosa Place and Westwood Drive, running some <u>300 feet</u> to the intersection of Mimosa Place and Flamingo Drive. Additionally, a <u>320 foot long</u> section of proposed 8" DIP in Flamingo Drive is to connect to the main in Windwood Drive from in front of lot 90-4-7.

Work shown on our survey sheet 1 of 3 includes a new 8" DIP proposed to connect at Windwood Drive progressing <u>275 feet</u> west on Clover Lane then <u>310 feet</u> north on Linden Drive then <u>230</u> feet west on Sandalwood Drive to connect to the existing main in front of parcel 91–3–7.

Line valves are to be added to provide some control during necessary partial shut downs.

It is believed that the existing sewer and the water services are in the same trench. We would propose to put them back in the same trench, in a stepped trench where the water is 18 inches above the sewer and perhaps having the new water service encased in a sleeve pipe which is water tight.

An existing force main exists, discharging from Lot 90-6-2, to the southern side of the right-ofway discharging out to Route 17K. Our surveyors picked up a sanitary valve box.

The traffic loop controlling the traffic signals at the intersection of Arbor Drive and Route 17K will be added to the plans as the survey does not show this existing feature.

Lastly, per our discussion, we have added a phase to the proposal for providing ground penetrating radar as may be necessary.

This proposal is divided into two sections as follows:

Section I – Scope of Services

Section II – Client Contract Authorization

The following scope of services has been separated into phases so that it may be more easily reviewed. The order in which the phases are presented generally follows the sequence in which the project will be accomplished; however, depending on the project, the various authorized services contained in this proposal may be performed in a sequence as deemed appropriate by Maser Consulting to meet project schedules.
