TOWN OF NEWBURGH EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATIONS CHARTER BUS SERVICE FOR RECREATION DEPARTMENT TRIP PROGAM

- 1. All buses must be model year 2009 or newer and equipped with anti-lock brakes.
- 2. The exterior of the bus must be well painted and clean with no signs of damage.
- 3. The interior of the bus must be clean with upholstery and flooring in good condition.
- 4. All on-board restroom facilities must be completely functioning and clean. Restrooms must be serviced as often as necessary to avoid offensive odors in the rear portion of the bus.
- 5. Air-conditioning and heating must be in excellent working order.
- 6. All buses provided for scheduled trips MUST be in good condition and meet all Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration rules, regulations and guidelines. All maintenance records for buses to be provided must be available to the Town of Newburgh for inspection.
- 7. If an inspection of your bus or buses is requested by the Town of Newburgh, the inspection should take place within ten (10) working days of request. The records for the bus or buses MUST BE WITH THE BUS OR BUSES AT THE TIME OF THE INSPECTION. Failure to provide these records will eliminate your bid from consideration.

The successful bidder shall be responsible for furnishing all labor and equipment necessary for the removal and disposal of alum sludge from the Town of Newburgh's Chadwick Lake <u>AND</u> Delaware Aqueduct Water Treatment Plants (WTP's).

The Successful bidder shall provide the alum sludge removal and disposal service on a call-as-needed basis for the period through December 31st of the calendar year of the bid.

However, the Town Board reserves the right to terminate this contract prior to the end of the calendar year of the bid, upon 30 days written notice. Said notice to be sent certified mail, return receipt requested.

The price bid shall be on a unit price per gallon of sludge removed and include all costs of labor, equipment, transportation and final disposal. The Town of Newburgh is a taxexempt organization. All bids shall be submitted on the following conditions.

- 1. Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time for the opening of Bids or authorized postponements thereof. Any bid received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. No bidder may withdraw a bid within 45 days after the actual date of the opening thereof. Should there be reasons why the contract cannot be awarded within the specified period, the time may be extended by mutual agreement.

A total of \$93,652.00 was collected for combined Landscaping and Stormwater Securities on the site. It is noted that the landscaping on this site as well as a 4 foot high chain link fence were added to the plans and the cost estimate by the Applicant after conversations with neighboring property owners. To date the stormwater improvements have been substantially completed in compliance with the approved plans. The landscaping trees have been installed. The 4 foot high chain link fence was estimated at \$4,250.00. This cost was not included in the original bond estimates of \$93,652.00. It is recommended that the Town Board release the original bond amount retaining 1.5 times \$4250.00 or \$6,375.00.

Based on the above this office takes no exception to the Town reducing existing cash security from \$93,652.00 to \$6,375.00.
