Stormwater Control Facility Maintenance Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT is made this _____ day of April, 2016, by and between the Town of Newburgh, having an address at 1496 Route 300, Newburgh, New York 12550 ("Municipality") and DRA Fidelco Newburgh, LLC, having an address at 47 River Road, Summit, New Jersey 07901 (the "Facility Owner").

Whereas, the Municipality and the Facility Owner want to enter into an agreement to provide for the long term maintenance and continuation of stormwater control measures approved by the Municipality for the below named project; and

Whereas, the Facility Owner is the owner of certain real property in the Town of Newburgh consisting of approximately 4.95 acres more particularly described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and made a part hereof (the "Property"); and

Whereas, the Municipality and the Facility Owner desire that the stormwater control measures be built, in accordance with the approved project plans entitled Summit Lane at Newburgh Expansion as approved by the Town of Newburgh Planning Board on February 4, 2016, and thereafter be maintained, cleaned, repaired, replaced and continued in perpetuity in order to ensure optimum performance of the components.

Now, therefore, the Municipality and the Facility Owner agree as follows:

1. This agreement binds the Municipality and the Facility Owner, its successors and assigns to the maintenance provisions depicted in the approved project plans and Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan which are on file with the Municipality's Stormwater Management Officer.

2. The Facility Owner shall maintain, clean, repair, replace and continue the stormwater control measures depicted on the approved project plans for the Facility known as Summit Lane at Newburgh Expansion on and about the Property, as necessary to ensure optimum performance of the measures to design specifications. The stormwater control measures shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following: drainage ditches, swales, dry wells, infiltrators, drop inlets, pipes, culverts, soil absorption devices and retention ponds and other stormwater practices identified in the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) approved by the Municipality.

3. The Facility Owner shall be responsible for all expenses related to the maintenance of the stormwater control measures and shall establish a means for the collection and distribution of expenses among parties for any commonly owned facilities.

4. The Facility Owner shall provide for the periodic inspection of the stormwater control measures, not less than once a year, to determine the condition and integrity of the measures. Such inspection shall be performed by a Professional Engineer licensed by the State of New

York. The inspecting engineer shall prepare and submit to the Municipality within 30 days of the inspection, a written report of the findings including recommendations for those actions necessary for the continuation of the stormwater control measures.

5. The Facility Owner shall not authorize, undertake or permit alteration, abandonment, modification or discontinuation of the stormwater control measures except in accordance with written approval of the Municipality. The obligations of the Facility Owner under paragraphs 2, 3, 4 and 6 of this Agreement shall toll upon the completion of the establishment of a drainage district of the Municipality and the acceptance of the dedication of the stormwater control measures by the Municipality. The tolling period shall end upon the discontinuance or dissolution of the municipal drainage district.

6. The Facility Owner shall undertake necessary maintenance, repairs and replacement of the stormwater control measures at the direction of the Municipality or in accordance with the recommendations of the inspecting engineer.

7. The Facility Owner shall provide to the Municipality within 30 days of the date of this agreement, such security for the maintenance and continuation of the stormwater control measures as the Municipality may have required in its approval in the form acceptable to the Town Engineer and Town Attorney (a bond, letter of credit or escrow account).

8. This agreement shall be recorded in the Office of the County Clerk, County of Orange and shall be included in any offering plan and/or prospectus or lease. All rights, title and privileges herein granted, including all benefits and burdens, shall run with the land and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, assigns and legal representatives.

9. If ever the Municipality determines that the Facility Owner has failed to construct or maintain the stormwater control measures in accordance with the project plans or has failed to undertake corrective action specified by the Municipality or by the inspecting engineer, the Municipality is authorized to undertake such steps as reasonably necessary for the preservation, continuation or maintenance of the stormwater control measures and to affix the expenses thereof as a lien against the property. The Facility Owner shall reimburse the Municipality for all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred in enforcing this Agreement and curing a violation.

On behalf of the Town of Newburgh (the Town), the hydrogeologic consulting firm of Leggette, Brashears & Graham, Inc. (LBG) has completed an assessment of the feasibility of developing a water supply for the Town from the local groundwater resources. The minimum yield of the new groundwater supply desired by the Town is about 1.7 million gallons per day (MGD). Our assessment focused on using available hydrogeologic and geologic information to identify potentially accessible locations within the Town for possible consideration as future supply well sites.

Background

The Town is contemplating development of a groundwater supply capable of a minimum yield of about 1.7 MGD as a replacement alternate supply for when the New York City aqueduct goes off-line for repairs circa 2020. In addition, the Town is looking to use this supply as an alternative to help meet its current peak demand of about 4.2 MGD developed from its existing surface-water source which is experiencing water quality issues associated with frequent filter fouling. Assuming that the local groundwater resources can support the targeted demand, the new groundwater supply is anticipated to be developed using one or more wells.

The Town is located in northeastern Orange County, New York, and is bordered to the east by the Hudson River and the City of Newburgh, to the south by the Town of New Windsor, the west by the Town of Montgomery, and to the north by Ulster County (Figure 1). The Town occurs within the Hudson River drainage basin, with all streams in the Town eventually discharging to the Hudson River. The current surface-water supply for the Town is developed from Chadwick Lake located in the Quassaick Creek watershed.

The Town is located in the Valley and Ridge Physiographic Province, with the local topography being generally characterized by a north-northeast trending sequence of relatively low lying ridges and valleys, and undulating hills of low relief (typically several hundred feet in elevation). The topography not only reflects the underlying bedrock surface, but also locally accumulated unconsolidated materials of glacial origin.

Local Hydrogeologic Conditions

The Town and surrounding area are generally underlain by varying thickness of unconsolidated deposits (overburden), primarily of glacial (directly by the ice, and indirectly by meltwater deposition) and alluvial (stream deposited) origin (Figure 2). These deposits are typically underlain by unconsolidated material composed of weathered bedrock, and/or competent bedrock. The movement and storage of groundwater in the overburden is controlled primarily by the intergranular pore-spaces of the respective unconsolidated materials.

The majority of the overburden occurring in the Town consists primarily of a lowpermeability (poor water transmitting potential) mixture of glacially-deposited clay, silt, sand and gravel identified as "till." Though the till is not typically considered a favorable deposit for supporting potential groundwater supply development, these materials can locally act as a source of recharge to abutting and/or underlying formations (e.g., bedrock). The majority of the western portion of the Town is underlain by stratified (layered) materials deposited by glacial meltwater (e.g., "outwash" or stratified "drift") or local streams ("alluvium"), with a concentration around Orange Lake and the lowlands north of Chadwick Lake. Stratified materials also reportedly occur in the northeastern section of the Town, north of Roseton along the Hudson River. Where these deposits consist primarily of sand and gravel, the corresponding permeability can typically range from medium to high, and can commonly provide favorable conditions for groundwater supply development (see "Unconsolidated Sand & Gravel Deposits" on Figure 2).

The overburden in the Town and surrounding area is underlain by bedrock primarily consisting of Ordovician-age (over 440 million years old) sedimentary rock units. These bedrock units are generally composed of greywacke, sandstone, siltstone, shale, and slate belonging to the Normanskill Shale (aka Martinsburg) Formation (Fisher, et al., 1970; Figure 3). The remainder of the Town is underlain by localized occurrences of fault-bounded Ordovician-age "carbonate" bedrock (e.g., limestone and dolostone), and Precambrian-age (over 500 million years old) "crystalline" bedrock (e.g., gneiss).

The sedimentary bedrock units underlying the Town are dominated by layers or "beds" of shale, associated with the deposition of the parent geologic materials. These shale beds are typically penetrated by fractures (i.e., partings or openings) which either correspond to: the contacts between overlying and underlying beds (i.e., bedding planes); or past geologically-induced movement, and "loading" and "unloading" (i.e., geological forces and stresses) imparted on the comprising bedrock mass. The fractures associated with geological forces and stresses generally occur at a vertical to sub-vertical angle with respect to the bedding (typically horizontal to sub-horizontal). Fractures penetrating the carbonate and crystalline bedrock units located in the south-central and eastern portions of the Town are generally related to the same geological (structural) forces and stresses, provide the primary feature that influences groundwater movement and storage in the associated bedrock units. Intergranular pore spaces which can occur in the sedimentary rock units, can provide limited minor influence on groundwater movement and storage.

Fracture traces and related larger-scale lineaments, are naturally-occurring linear surficial features which correspond to topographic, vegetative or soil-tonal alignments. These features are considered to potentially be the surface expression of fractures and fracture zones in the underlying bedrock. Such features are typically identified utilizing aerial photographs and topographic maps. As discussed earlier, wells penetrating fractures and fracture zones in bedrock, typically exhibit higher yields than those penetrating non-fractured bedrock. The existence of fracture traces should be verified in the field ("ground truthing") prior to drilling. Depending on the local geologic conditions, the existence of water-bearing fractures associated with respective traces can sometimes be confirmed by using surface geophysical techniques.

Based on the readily-available information for the area, significant fracture-associated bedrock features exist in the central and northeastern portions of the Town (Figure 4). The majority of the identified features tend to be oriented roughly northeast-southwest or northwest-southeast. Stereo-pair aerial photographs were obtained for the area northeast of Stewart International Airport, and for the northeastern corner of the Town. An area-specific fracture trace analysis was completed for these areas, and assessed in conjunction with fracture-trace intersections previously identified from aerial photography (LBG 1995) and with published regional-scale maps of bedrock fractures and structures (Isachsen and McKendree, 1977).

Groundwater Supply Development Potential

Based on the reviewed readily-availably information regarding the local geology and groundwater supply potential of the overburden and bedrock in the Town area, both formations appear to locally have the potential to support a future public community water supply [e.g., long-term well yields in excess of 100 gallons per minute (gpm)]. Available information from the NYSDEC Water Well database indicates that private wells (e.g., homeowner supply;

commercial building supply) tapping the Normanskill Shale and Austin Glen Formations (sedimentary bedrock) which underlie the Town, are generally characterized by low yields, with nearby supply wells ranging in capacity from 1.5 gpm to about 30 gpm, with a median value of about 10 gpm. However, since most of these are likely private residential wells, it can be assumed that the installation locations were likely not selected in order to maximize the corresponding yield, but to accommodate site logistics (e.g., house set back, etc.). Higher yielding wells reportedly completed in the Normanskill Shale, are located west of Orange Lake, and exhibit yields ranging from 18 gpm to 165 gpm. Private supply wells tapping the Wappinger Group carbonate bedrock formation in the area reportedly exhibit an average yield of about 20 gpm. Reportedly wells tapping local sand and gravel formations located north of Chadwick Lake have capacities of up to 300 gpm, and wells tapping a sand and gravel formation located near the northwest corner of the City of Newburgh reportedly exhibit yields between 300 and 1,000 gpm. The depths of private wells in the area, reportedly range from 93 feet to 605 feet, with an average of 310 feet.

Based on a combination of hydrogeologic and reported well yield considerations, eight areas (Areas 1 through 8) have been identified as possible candidate sites for future development of a groundwater supply for the Town (Figure 4). Area 1 corresponds to an area on the northern edge of the Town associated with the reported occurrence of glacial outwash materials with related potential well capacities of 300 gpm. Areas 2 and 3 coincide with the location of a significant geologic structure (i.e., fracture trace) associated with the underlying bedrock (Austin Glen Formation) which absent of such features typically has a lower yield capacity. Similarly, Areas 4 and 5 are located in areas where notable geologic structures (i.e., fracture traces and lineaments) exist, but the associated bedrock (Normanskill Shale) generally exhibits a lower yield capacity. Area 6 occupies an area reportedly underlain by carbonate bedrock belonging to the Wappingers Group, which generally exhibits a higher well yield potential. Based on areaspecific fracture-trace analyses, significant geologic structures exist in this area. Area 7 corresponds to a geologically complex area that the area-specific fracture-trace analyses indicates coincides with the presence of bedrock structures. In addition, this area is reportedly overlain by sand and gravel deposits, which may contribute additional recharge to the local bedrock. Area 8 was selected based on the locale-specific fracture-trace analyses results and the reported occurrence of significant overlying of sand and gravel deposits (based on corresponding well logs).

In order to assess the actual yield potential of a groundwater supply for any of these areas, implementation of a focused exploration and testing program (e.g., borings, test wells, and pumping tests) will be necessary. This program is best implemented by concentrating on land parcels identified as being readily-accessible and obtainable in the future by the Town. In addition, the Town will need to have the ability to control or own a minimum of 200 feet about any future well installation being pursued as a public community water supply, as required by the

NYSDOH. As such, the Town should also base its parcel selection in part on the absence of surface-water bodies, wetlands, sensitive habitats, and contamination sites.

Regarding listed contamination sites, none have been identified by the NYSDEC as occurring within 0.5 miles of any of the potential groundwater development areas (Figure 4). The closest reported site is about 0.8 miles southeast of Area 5. Listed contamination sites located within 1 mile of Areas 3 and 8 are reported by the NYSDEC as "closed" or requiring "no further action at this time." Based on the discussed hydrogeologic conditions and corresponding yield potential, along with reported contaminated site locations and conditions, the following table has been developed for use by the Town in helping to prioritize the selection of areas for future considerations and exploration:

Future Well Recommendations

As previously discussed, eight areas have been identified for further consideration as possible groundwater supply well sites for the Town. The next step to assessing the potential of these areas is to install "test" wells at one or more selected accessible and favorable locations to

evaluate the site-specific hydrogeologic conditions, and groundwater yield and quality. The construction and number of the respective test wells will need to be consistent with the targeted groundwater bearing formation. In the event that one or more of these wells proved favorable, they could be either re-classified, modified, or replaced to allow for future use as an NYSDEC/NYSDOH-viable groundwater supply by the Town. Besides the accessibility of the targeted parcels, prioritization should also be based on proximity to the existing water-supply distribution system.

Future Bedrock Supply Wells

The potential for developing a groundwater supply for the Town from the local bedrock is greatest for Areas 6 and 7. The yield of a well in either of these areas would be generally maximized when the intake zone (open borehole) intersects as many groundwater bearing fractures as possible. As such, selection of the location for a possible test well intended to tap the local bedrock aquifer should be based upon the ability to site the well at the potential occurrence of bedrock fractures and fracture intersections in the corresponding areas.

Potential well location(s) for the respective areas should be selected depending on the available parcel using the completed fracture trace analysis results, followed up by field verification ("ground-truthing"), and subsequent "staking" of the recommended "test" well location. For planning and budgeting considerations, the Town should assume an estimated cost for the construction and development of one bedrock (test) well, completed at a depth of about 300 feet, to be about \$30,000.

Future Overburden Supply Wells

Based on the available information, the overburden (sand and gravel) aquifer located in the proximity of Area 1 and Area 8 should be considered as possible sources of groundwater supply. The overall thickness, permeability (reflective of dominant grain size composition), saturated thickness, and available recharge will ultimately determine the potential yield of a well tapping these possible aquifers. In considering applicable NYSDOH public water supply construction requirements, the encountered overburden thickness in this area will need to exceed a minimum of about 20 feet to accommodate the approved construction of a future supply well for the Town. Since both of these also correspond to potentially favorable bedrock conditions, the overburden materials could be evaluated in conjunction with any bedrock exploration efforts.

Exploratory boring (and possible small-diameter test well) locations should be sited and "staked" in the field with the assistance of a hydrogeologist at those parcels identified as accessible by the Town prior to drill rig mobilization. The selected boring locations should ideally be at least 200-feet away from surface-water bodies, 200 to 300 feet from known and potential pollution sources (e.g., sewer lines, septic systems), and at least 150 feet outside of designated wetlands (should be confirmed and flagged). The targeted sites should be accessible

with a standard drill rig (tracked mounted rigs are typically more expensive to use). At least one small (4-inch) diameter test well should be installed and pumped for a short duration to evaluate the yield potential of the overburden at any boring locations where adequate saturated sand and gravel thickness is penetrated.

For planning and budgeting purposes, the Town should anticipate a cost of approximately \$10,000 to \$15,000 for a drilling contractor to complete four borings and related small diameter test wells with short-term testing. The actual costs will depend on site access and actual boring and well depth. If the exploration work confirms adequate materials for development of a large-capacity supply well, a preliminary cost estimate for the construction and development of a single screened well is about \$120,000 to \$150,000. This preliminary cost estimate for an actual supply well includes the well design and technical specifications for inclusion in a bid package, drilling oversight, and well construction and development costs. Costs associated with testing of the well to obtain a Water Withdrawal Permit (WWP) from the NYSDEC, and engineering and construction needed to prepare necessary plan for NYSDOH approval to operate the well as a public community supply well are not included in this preliminary estimate.

Summary

Based on the reported hydrogeologic conditions, we recommend that both the overburden and bedrock aquifers be considered as potential sources of groundwater supply development for the Town in identified Areas 1 through 8. The available hydrogeologic and existing supply well information indicate the local sand and gravel deposits aquifer and/or the local bedrock aquifers have a potential of supporting the Town's groundwater supply yield requirement of at least 1.7 MGD. Of these eight areas, four have been identified as being the most favorable from a hydrogeologic basis.

The overburden aquifers in Area 1 and 8 should be explored by advancing borings and installing small diameter test wells in accessible parcels identified by the Town. The small diameter wells can be used to conduct short-duration (i.e., up to four hours) pumping tests to evaluate local aquifer characteristics and yield. In addition, both areas may warrant consideration of evaluation of the underlying bedrock aquifer also. Positive results can be used to determine the feasibility of installing a future test and production well at the respective location(s).

The carbonate bedrock aquifer consisting of the Wappingers Group underlying Areas 6 and 7 should as a possible groundwater supply source. The bedrock in several other areas was also identified, but is believed to have a lower yield potential. A proposed test well targeting this bedrock aquifer should be constructed with a minimum six-inch diameter casing (preferably eight inch) and open borehole intake extending to a depth of at least 300 feet below grade (ft bg), contingent upon the encountered conditions. The test well(s) should be constructed with a minimum of 19 feet of casing, set into competent bedrock (as per NYSDEC), and subsequently tested.

Borings and test well installations for the overburden and bedrock aquifers should be overseen and directed by an on-site hydrogeologist. Favorable wells should be evaluated for yield also under the direction of the on-site hydrogeologist. If favorable conditions are encountered in any of the explored areas, then the Town can consider subsequent public community supply well installation and/or conversion efforts along with the pursuit of a WPP for the new supply. The required well design and pumping tests should be developed, coordinated, and evaluated by a qualified hydrogeologist. If requested, we would be happy to provide you with a proposal for these respective services.

The Town Board has recently (or will shortly) approved an Intermunicipal Water Supply Agreement with the Town of New Windsor. The Agreement provides that Newburgh will supply up to 1.5 mgd of emergency water supply to New Windsor with 1 mgd being delivered to the Union Avenue interconnection and 0.5 mgd being supplied to the Express Drive interconnection (reciprocally, New Windsor agrees to supply Newburgh with up to 2.0 mgd of emergency water supply). The ability to supply this water is critically dependent on the operation of the Chadwick Lake Filter Plant.

Additionally, Newburgh has its own critical dependency on the ability of Chadwick Lake Filter Plant to supply 2 mgd or more during the Delaware Aqueduct shutdown.

Based on the above and other issues with the water quality of the Chadwick Lake Reservoir discussed previously, I am requesting Town Board authorization to solicit proposals for an evaluation of the short term and long term economic viability of the Chadwick Lake water supply. I am proposing the following approach to accomplish this:

- Solicit technical proposals from pre-selected engineering firms consisting of a proposed scope of services. The engineering firm should provide a scope based on the focused needs of the Town and their own expertise in water supply and treatment. Suggested items to be addressed are given below:
 - A. What improvements can be made to improve the operational reliability of the plant?

B. Can the existing plant be modified to address the deficiencies identified in the NYSDOH Comprehensive Performance Evaluation:

- 1. Pre-Treatment for removal of NOM
- 2. Improvements to Sedimentation Basin plate \ tube settles, DAF
- 3. Construction of new filters (30 to 48 inches of filter media)
- 4. Conversion to membrane filtration (pressure or vacuum)
- 5. Conversion to Biological Filtration
- 6. Improvements to performance of sludge lagoons to increase concentration of solids.
- C. What measures, if any, can be taken to improve the water quality of Chadwick Lake?
 - 1. Biofiltration of any portion of influent stream flow?
 - 2. Dredging of Chadwick Lake.
- 2. Review and rank the scope of services with respect to addressing the Town's needs. (Ranking committee to consist of TE, DPW Commissioner, and Chief Operator with input from Town Board.)
- 3. Solicit a cost proposal from most qualified proposals.
- 4. Interview Engineering Firm.
- 5. Make selection.

As the above requires Town Board action, I am requesting that this item be placed on the next available agenda for approval. If you have any questions or comments, I am available to discuss them with you.

CHADWICK LAKE RESERVOIR AND FILTER PLANT STUDY

By contract with New York City, the Town of Newburgh is required to have a Backup Water Supply, especially critical for upcoming Delaware Aqueduct Shut-Down scheduled for 2021.

Projected need for 2021 is estimated to be **3.8 Million Gallons per Day**. Long term projected need is **4.5 MGD**.

Existing and potential back-up supplies consist of the following:

- 1. Chadwick Lake Reservoir & Filter Plant
- 2. Purchase back-up water supply from New Windsor
- 3. Purchase back-up water supply from City of Newburgh
- Develop new groundwater supplies

Need to study Chadwick Lake Reservoir & Filter Plant driven by the following:

- 1. NYSDOH has identified limited capability for CLFP to meet new regulations technology, especially the filters, are limited in providing treatment beyond current standards. Report recommended that the Town begin looking at the upgrade/replacement needs of the CLFP to prepare for same. Recent inspection report asked about Newburgh's progress.
- 2. By contract with New York City, Town is required to provide an analysis of its firm safe yield of its back-up supplies certified by a professional engineer. The recent blue-green algae bloom caused CLFP to be shut down during critical summer months.
- 3. CLFP is still projected to play a critical role in meeting the Town's demands during the Delaware Aqueduct shut-down.
- 4. Detailed cost estimates are required to make correct financial decision concerning permanent back-up water supply option.

Previous studies concentrated on improvements to the **existing plant** required to meet evolving filter turbidity standards. Original plant was designed to meet a filtered water turbidity of 1.0 NTU. In 1986, the requirement was lowered to 0.5 NTU filtered water turbidity. Current standard is 0.3 NTU filtered water turbidity. Recent Optimization Study concentrated almost exclusively on maximizing sedimentation basin performance as a means to maintain adequate filter performance.

Proposed study would eliminate the restriction of trying to salvage the original CLFP. The study would concentrate on identifying a treatment technology that would reliably treat Chadwick Lake water over the full range of raw water quality conditions and as a secondary goal maximize usage of any existing structures or unit processes. The study would also address any measures to improve the water quality of the Chadwick Lake Reservoir (e.g. the Renewage Stormwater Treatment system proposed for the Plattekill Creek flow). The results of the study can then be compared to the other water supply options.

This Agreement made by and between The Town of Newburgh (Town) and McGoey, Hauser and Edsall Consulting Engineers, D.P.C. (Engineer, MH&E, Site Monitor).

WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties hereto for themselves, their successors and assigns, have mutually agreed and do agree with each other as follows:

Section 1. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT. The project for which professional engineering services shall be rendered under this Agreement shall include site work monitoring and periodic construction review on behalf of the Town for the Matrix project located in the Town of Newburgh comprised of Tax Map Parcel Section 95 Block 1 Lots 69.25, 4.12, 49.12 and 54.1 and others all which are collectively referred to herein as the site. The Town of Newburgh Planning Board has granted final site plan approval by resolution dated 18 February 2016 (conditional final approval) allowing the development of up to 565,320 square feet of warehouse

distribution center known as Matrix Newburgh LLC (the project). Whereas in the course of the proceedings of the approval before the Town Planning Board, Matrix Newburgh LLC., voluntarily agreed to establish and fund an escrow account with sufficient funds to defray the anticipated cost of services for professional engineering firm to be selected by the Town to provide site work monitoring and construction review as deemed reasonably necessary by the Town and commensurate with the degree of on-site construction being undertaken by the developer. This work will be in compliance with the basic services identified in Section 2 below. The Approval Resolution adopted by the Town Planning Board with respect to the project recites that the Project Sponsor will underwrite the cost for the services to be provided under the terms of perform the duty imposed upon them by this agreement. The Town and the Engineer acknowledge that the developer has requested that the Engineer shall use commercially reasonable efforts to assign tasks to the qualified firm representative carrying the lowest billing rate in the performance of the Services. The Town also acknowledges that the Engineer maintains the sole authority to select and assign personnel based upon scheduling and level of qualifications required for specific tasks.

Section 2. BASIC SERVICES. The professional services to be rendered by the Engineer shall include the following:

- a. Field reviews of the project with regard to monitoring the project the implementation of Soil Erosion control and Storm water Pollution Prevention plan. This task will involve periodic onsite review of Soil Erosion, Sediment Control, and Storm water Management Facilities. The Project Sponsor shall submit the Town/site monitor copies of all field reviews, inspection reports and other documents generated by the project sponsor's consultant in compliance with NYSDEC Regulations, and Town of Newburgh permit approvals. Reports generated by the project's consultant shall be submitted to the Town site monitor within 7 days of reports being generated.
- b. On site monitoring for compliance with SEQRA Negative declaration. The project's sponsor has agreed to certain conditions which have been incorportated in the Lead Agency (Newburgh Planning Board) negative declaration regarding environmental impacts on the project site. McGoey Hauser & Edsall (MH&E) personnel will provide periodic on site review to evaluate compliance with SEQRA negative declarations. MH&E will provide periodic reports to the Town of Newburgh regarding compliance with SEQRA conditions. SEQRA compliance will generally involve monitoring of Soil Erosion and Sediment Control, blasting activities, site grading activities, installation of Best Management Practices, engineering controls incorporated into the plans, and general compliance with plans, specifications and supplementary conditions of approval.
- c. Field review of site improvement installations MH&E will provide support to Town of Newburgh personnel including field review during installation of site improvements including but not limited to storm water management Facilities, drainage collection piping and appurtenances, water and sewer utilities, barriers, access road and parking lot construction. MH&E will provide reports to the Town on a weekly basis.

- d. Attendance at meetings. MH&E personnel will attend construction progress meetings as scheduled by the Town of Newburgh.
- e. MH&E will provide construction site monitoring with regard to receiving and evaluating citizen complaints as received by agencies of the Town of Newburgh. Complaints forwarded by the Town will be evaluated and reports will be provided recommending action to address issues identified in complaints forwarded from the Town agencies to the MH&E personnel.

Section 3. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES. Payment for professional services described in Section 2 of this Agreement shall be made in such amounts and at such times as are hereinafter designated and set forth:

Payment for all services described in Section 2 shall on an hourly basis per the attached Fee Schedule which shall be due and payable based upon monthly invoices for effort expended.

Engineer shall submit monthly vouchers for Services rendered and for reasonable and customary reimbursable expenses incurred to the Town which shall make payments in response to Engineer's monthly statements in accordance with its audit procedures and this Section 1. The Engineer's vouchers shall have attached to them itemized billing statements setting forth the date billed tasks were performed, the identity of the individual performing the task, the actual time spent on the task, the rate charged, the cost of the service, and a reasonable description of the task.

Payments shall be due within thirty days after submission of the invoice.

If the Town fails to make any payment due Engineer for services and expenses within thirty (30) days after receipt of Engineer's bill therefore, the amount due Engineer shall include a charge at the rate of 1-1/2% per month from said thirtieth day, and in addition Engineer may, after giving seven (7) days written notice to Town, suspend services under this Agreement until Engineer has been paid in full all amounts due for services and expenses.

Section 4. CHANGES.

1. <u>Changes During The Term of Agreement</u> - In the event that material changes in plans or scope of the work are directed in writing by the Town of Newburgh, the Town of Newburgh agrees to pay Engineer the accumulated charges for services, on a negotiated basis, to the date of the change in the plan or scope of services. The services for the revised scope shall then be completed by the Engineer with compensation or as mutually agreed upon.

Section 5. TOWN'S RESPONSIBILITIES. The Town shall use commercially reasonable efforts to require the Project Sponsor to make available to the Engineer all records and data pertinent to the project and will give reasonable assistance to the engineer in obtaining additional information which may be required. The Engineer shall have the opportunity to confer with the project's sponsors, officials and other persons who may be a position to furnish information relative to the project.
Section 6. ADDITIONAL SERVICES. In the event the Town desires additional services to be rendered by Engineer in connection with the completion of the Project, beyond the scope of the services described in Article 2 of this Agreement, Engineer agrees to perform said additional services, if ordered in writing, on a mutually acceptable basis, as per attached January 2015 Standard Fee Schedule.

Section 7. TERMINATION OF SERVICES. If all or any part of the engineering services to be performed under the Agreement are ordered to be suspended or omitted by Owner, Owner agrees to make such order in writing at least thirty days prior to the desired date of termination of service and to pay Engineer for such suspended or omitted services the accumulated fees to the date of termination of service in accordance with the methods of payment described in Article 3.

Section 8. ASSIGNMENT. The Engineer shall not assign or transfer any duties, rights under or interests in (including, but without limitation, moneys that may become due or moneys that are due) this Agreement, except to the extent of any assignment or transfer is mandated by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the Engineer from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement.

Section 9. INSURANCE. Engineer agrees to procure and maintain applicable insurance without additional expense to Owner, for the term of this agreement. Before commencing work, Engineer shall furnish to Owner, if requested, a certificate or certificates showing that the requirements of this Article have been complied with. This certificate or certificates shall provide that the policies shall not be changed or cancelled until ten (10) days after prior written notice has been given to Owner.

Section 10. PROVISIONS OF LAW. All provisions of law required to be made a part of this Agreement are hereby deemed incorporated herein. Performance under the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be subject to and in conformance with all applicable laws.

Section 11. MAPS, PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS. All reports, and other documents prepared by Engineer, being instruments of service, shall be considered the property of Engineer until paid for as herein set forth, and the right to use same shall not pass from Engineer to the Town of Newburgh until all payments agreed to hereunder have been fully made.

Section 12. ENGINEER'S RESPONSIBILITY LIMITED. The Engineer shall in no way be responsible for the Contractor's means, methods, or techniques of construction nor for any safety precautions incident thereto. The Engineer shall not be responsible for the Contractor's compliance or failure to comply with the approved Plans and Specifications, permits, codes, rules, and regulations.

Section 13. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. The Owner agrees to limit the Engineer's liability to the Owner and to all the Contractors, persons or firms furnishing services, materials or labor in connection with this Proposal, due to negligent acts, errors or omissions, such that the total aggregate liability of the Engineer shall not exceed the cost of services under this Proposal of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00); whichever is less.

1) Provide daily testing per the SPDES permit; settable solids, pH, DO, Cl2 residual, etc.

- 2) Perform routine daily housekeeping; clean bar rack, etc.
- 3) Monitor plant process for abnormal conditions that vary from typical operation, and contact Town personnel to repair.
- 4) Maintain chlorine residuals.
- 5) Complete daily log sheets.

The cost to provide this service is \$136.00 per day, or \$272.00 per weekend based on an hourly rate of \$68.00. The details still need to be worked out if this proposal is something that the Town might be interested in. However, there should be no significant changes in scope or costs.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR SEWER DEPARTMENT ONLY

Stipulation of agreement made and entered into this \mathcal{H} day of January, 2016, by and between the Town of Newburgh (Town) and Civil service Employees Association, Inc Unit #7913, Orange County Local 836, AFSCME, AFL-CIO ("The Union") for Hours of Operation (Sewer Department Only).

WHEREAS, The Town and the Union parties to a collective bargaining Agreement for the term January 1, 2013 – December 31, 2015 ("The Agreement"), and;

WHEREAS, the parties agree that it is in the best interest of the parties to amend the collective bargaining agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereby stipulate and agree to modify Article II, Work Day-Work Week, Section 2, as follows:

- All three Sewer Department employees will work the normal workweek of Monday thru Friday from 7:00 am to 3:30 pm daily. All three employees will continue the weekly rotating schedule to carry the off-hour emergency pager and if called out, receive in compensation four (4) hours of compensation leave. However, on the week that the employee is carrying the pager, that employee will work only four (4) hours on Friday morning and will be required to come in for two (2) hours on both Saturday and Sundays to conduct the necessary inspections and recording at the Nob Hill Sewer Plant at regular hours. Within this agreement the Town will meet its DEC obligations and have all sewer department employees available during normal weekday working hours.
- 2. This agreement will also provide for continuous seven days per week coverage without incurring the high cost of premium overtime coverage for weekends.
- 3. Additionally, within this agreement, Sewer Department employees agree not to request or take personal or vacation leave on the weekends they are required to work that would result in overtime costs to the Town. If an employee is called out for an emergency call on Saturday or Sunday before he has come in to check the Nob Hill Sewer Plant, that employee will

conduct his routine inspection at the sewer plant during that call-out period of time. If the employee is called in later in the day, after he has conducted his required two (2) hour inspections and sampling recordings, he shall be paid the normal four (4) hour call-out.

- 4. Nothing contained in this agreement shall be precedent setting on either party.
- 5. Any and all disputes of this agreement shall be processed through Appendix B, GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE of The Agreement
- 6. This Agreement must be approved by the Town Board and Delete Martified by CSEA Town of Newburgh Unit members and will become effective upon full approval by both bodies. Town Board

As many in our close community well know, our six year old son Xavier Torres lost his three and a half year battle with brain cancer last May. In his short but very happy life, he enjoyed going to Chadwick Lake Park, playing on the playground, dressing up like superheros, firemen and police officers as well as making new friends wherever he went. Whether he was in treatment at the hospitals, at school or participating in community events, Xavier touched so many lives in such a beautiful way. During the funeral service, Father Patrick said that too often a life is measured by the clock and it is always sad when a life is cut short; however in Xavier's case, there are men far older than he that still have yet to experience all that Xavier did in such a short time. It is true that there is no greater loss than the loss of a child, and without the support of our beautiful community and the town that we love, this journey that our family is going through would be so much more difficult. It is with an extremely thankful heart that our family would like to recognize all the selfless dedication to our son by the local servicemen and community. And to show our gratitude and give our love back to the community, we would like to kindly request a dedication of a firetruck themed playground piece at Xavier's favorite park, Chadwick Lake, in his memory. Xavier was a superhero by every sense of the word, he fought a brave battle with brain cancer for three and a half years before he passed on May 12, 2015. Xavier never let his illness define him, or limit him in any way and he was a symbol of strength and bravery to all who knew him. Despite all the treatments, surgeries and obstacles he faced, he always found a way to smile at strangers, laugh hard, tell jokes and show love selflessly. Xavier had an infectious laugh that would fill the halls of the hospitals when we visited for treatment. He called all the nurses his "girlfirends". He was a celebrity just about everywhere he went and brought so many people together throughout his journey, letting his charismatic personality shine. He loved dressing up as Superman, Batman and Spiderman as well as role playing Firefighter and Police Officer. Three local Fire Depts adopted Xavier as an honorary Chief of the Department and gave him an official fire helmet. This contract and agreement entered into this S^{T^*} day of <u>MARCH</u> 2016, by and between FIREWORKS EXTRAVAGANZA a New York Corporation located at 174 R use 17 North, Rochelle Park NJ 07662

Robert Petrillo representing the Town of Newburgh whose address is 311 Boute 32, Newburgh, NY 12550 hereinafter referred to as the Sponsor.

WHEREAS, the parties have entered into an oral agreement relating to the sale and/or display of fireworks which they desire to have set forth in writing:

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. That FIREWORKS EXTRAVAGANZA intends to sell and/or display fireworks only to appropriately authorized individuals.

2. The Sponsor agrees to pay a display price NINE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$9,750.00) for the display agreed upon which will be exhibited by FIED WORES EXTRAVAGANZA on JULY 1, 2016 at a mutually agreed upon site.

3. Upon acceptance of this agreement, Sponsor agrees to pay a sum of 100% of the total cost of the display in the amount NINE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$9,750.00) due within ten (10) days after the display date agreed upon herein. Late payments will be subject to a finance charge.

4.
