TOWN OF NEWBURGH INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. _6_ OF 2014 AMENDING CHAPTER 185 ENTITLED "ZONING" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF NEWBURGH TO PROVIDE FOR BANKS AS A PERMITTED PRINCIPAL USE SUBJECT TO SITE PLAN REVIEW IN THE IB ZONING DISTRICT AND FOR SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR BANKS WITH DRIVE-THRU WINDOWS

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh, County of

Orange, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u> – TITLE

This Local Law shall be referred to as "A Local Law Amending Chapter 185 entitled 'Zoning' of the Code of the Town of Newburgh to Provide for Banks as a Permitted Principal Use Subject to Site Plan Review in the IB Zoning District and for Supplementary Regulations for Banks with Drive-thru Windows".

<u>SECTION 2 – PURPOSE AND INTENT</u>

The purpose of this local law is to permit banks as a principal use in the Interchange Business (IB) District subject to site plan review by the Planning Board. For purposes of this Local Law and the Zoning Code, the term banks shall include credit unions. Banks have been permitted in the IB District as part of shopping centers. The Town Board declares its intent to permit banks as a principal use subject to site plan review in the IB District without a requirement that the bank use be proposed in conjunction with a shopping center. The Board finds that the bank use is similar to and consistent with other principal commercial uses already separately permitted in the IB District. The Local Law also adds supplementary regulations for banks with drive-thru windows which are substantially similar to the existing supplementary regulations for drive-thru establishments.

SECTION 3 – AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 185

1. Chapter 185, "Zoning" of the Code of the Town of Newburgh, Table of Use and Bulk Requirements for the IB Zoning District, Schedule 8 of the Code adopted and incorporated into the Code pursuant to §185-10 entitled "Utilization of Use Table" and §185-11 entitled "Utilization of Bulk Table" shall be amended as follows:

A. Number 5 of Column D entitled "Uses Subject to Site Plan Review by the Planning Board" shall be amended to read as follows:

"5. Offices for business, research and professional use

and banks."

2. A new Section 185-45.6 entitled "Banks with drive-thru windows" is hereby added to Chapter 185 entitled "Zoning" of the Code of the Town of Newburgh to read as follows:

"§185-45.6 Banks with drive-thru windows.

Before approving any bank with a drive-thru window, the Planning Board shall consider:

(1) Vehicular traffic movements and potential hazards to pedestrian safety. All drive-thru aisles shall exit into a parking area, driveway or onto a side street and not directly onto Routes 9W, 17K, 32, 52 or 300.

(2) Proposed signs, lighting, speaker noise where residential properties are located nearby and landscaping.

(3) Public roads and internal drive aisles shall not be blocked by waiting drivethru traffic.

(4) Parking areas and circulation drives shall be adequately separated so as to avoid conflict between parking cars and waiting drive-thru traffic.

(5) Adequate stacking space will be provided for waiting drive-thru vehicles such that these vehicles do not interfere with site vehicular or pedestrian circulation.

(6) The site plan checklist for parking lot area traffic and pedestrian

movements/safety concerns shall be reviewed in preparation of plans."

<u>SECTION 4</u> – <u>VALIDITY</u>

If any word, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof or the application thereof to any other persons or circumstances but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered. The Town Board hereby declares that it would have enacted this Local Law or the remainder thereof if the invalidity of such provision or application thereof had been apparent.

<u>SECTION 5</u> – <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>

This Local Law shall take effect immediately when it is filed in the Office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

The project will also provide additional host community revenues to the Town.

Basic Terms

- Danskammer commits to a 10-year PILOT with two (2) annual payments per year, the first payable by September 30 and the second by January 31 of the following calendar year, in the initial aggregate amount of \$1.5 million, with annual 2% escalation provision.
- The September payment each year shall reflect the percentage amount payable to the Marlboro School District and the January payment each year shall reflect the percentages due to the Town of Newburgh and Orange County.
- PILOT payments shall not increase during the PILOT term, irrespective of the actual assessment of the project or any assessment changes due to improvements or upgrades, provided that such improvements do not increase facility generation capacity beyond current nameplate capacity rating.
- PILOT payments shall be split annually between the taxing jurisdictions based on current tax revenue percentages (i.e. 2014 Town/County taxes and 2013/14 school district taxes).
- Danskammer shall pay all special district charges on or before the dates due, but the PILOT shall provide that for the aggregate special district charges paid by Danskammer in any calendar year greater than a base amount of \$120,000, which base shall escalate 2% per year, such excess shall be credited against the next PILOT payment amount.
- PILOT is assignable to any successor owner(s), which shall assume the PILOT/IDA leasehold, as well as existing indemnification obligations, and Danskammer will be released from any continuing obligations after.
- Danskammer shall make all regular tax payments resulting from the Town's final 2014 assessment roll.

2014 WATER SYSTEM CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

The Town of Newburgh Consolidated Water District (TONCWD) has identified several capital project improvements necessary to be completed. These projects include the following:

- 1. Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank Painting and Improvements;
- 2. Fletcher Drive Water Main Extension and Meadow Hill Road / Route 52 Pumping Station Improvements;
- 3. Chadwick Lake Filter Plant Roof Replacement;
- 4. Water System Meter Replacement Program.

A detailed description of each of these projects and their associated costs are given below.

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

A. Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank Painting and Improvements:

The Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank is a welded steel tank located on Assembly Way in the Stewart Airport Industrial Park. The tank was erected in 1991 and has the original paint/coating system. Since its construction, the Town has leased space on the tank to four cellular phone carriers. The property on which the tank is located is an easement granted from the New York State Department of Transportation.

The Town of Newburgh engaged the service of GHD Consulting Engineers to conduct an inspection of the condition of the 1.8 Million Gallon Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank. In addition, GHD was tasked with evaluating and recommending a corrosion control technology, rehabilitation of an existing re-chlorination facility, a technology for the reduction of Total Tri-Halomethanes (TTHM) – a disinfection by-product, a method/technology for mixing the water in the tank, and a method to integrate the tank into the Town's SCADA system.

In March 2013, GHD issued a report entitled *Engineering Services for 1.8 MG Stewart* Airport Water Storage Tank – Final Report.

In the report, GHD evaluated alternatives and made recommendations to address the deficiencies in the condition of the existing tank coatings and to implement the water quality and operational improvements requested by the Town. Their specific recommendations are as follows:

- 1. The tank interior should be sand-blasted to Society of Protective Coating SP-10 (near white blast cleaning) and recoated with a 100 percent solids zinc/epoxy paint system.
- 2. The tank exterior should be sand-blasted to SP-6 (commercial blast cleaning) and recoated with an Extended Performance System of a three coat zinc/epoxy/urethane paint system.
- 3. For corrosion control, GHD recommended the use of a zinc rich primer for the tank interior (included in Item 1 above) rather than the use of a cathodic protection system.
- 4. To provide for the addition of chlorine into this part of the water distribution system to offset low chlorine residuals, GHD recommends the installation of new equipment in the existing on-site structure consisting of a weight scale, chlorine residual analyzer, metering pump skid, safety shower and eye wash, chemical injection assembly and a flow meter.
- 5. To reduce the TTHM levels, specifically chloroform levels in the water in the Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank, GHD has recommended the installation of a Solar Bee tank mixing system to provide turnover in the tank and reduce the water age. The need for a TTHM reduction system would be determined based on operational data with the mixing system in place.
- 6. To connect the Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank to the Town's existing SCADA system, GHD has recommended the installation of a cellular modem and a PLC based control panel.
- 7. To partially mitigate the loss of available fire flow to the Town's high pressure zone, GHD has recommended the installation of a connection between the Meadow Winds Tank and the Meadow Hills Tank controlled by a pressure reducing valve. The connection between the two service areas would be made on the west side of Meadow Hill Road near Fletcher Drive.

The total estimated cost for these improvements is **\$2,008,000** as shown on Table 1.

B. <u>Fletcher Drive Water Main Extension and Meadow Hill Road / Route 52 Pumping Station</u> <u>Improvements</u>.

As part of the Engineering Services for the 1.8 MG Stewart Airport Water Storage Tank Report, GHD evaluated distribution system improvements that would result in an increased operating range for the Meadow Hill and Stewart Airport Tanks. This operational adjustment will reduce pumping costs and improve the water quality in the distribution system.

Their recommendation was to transfer a portion of the Route 17K / Meadow Hill service area at the top of Meadow Hill to the service area served by the higher Meadow Winds tank. This could be accomplished by connecting the existing 12-inch main extending from Hibbing Way down North Fletcher Drive to the water main in Amber Drive. This would allow approximately 70 homes to be included in the Meadow Winds Service Area and allow the operating levels in the Meadow Hill / Stewart Airport Tanks to increase their operating range. The proposed project consists of the installation of approximately 2500 linear feet of 8-inch diameter ductile iron water main including transferring existing services onto the new main.

In addition, the report recommended the installation of flow meters in the Meadow Hill Road and Route 52 Water Booster Pumping Stations. This would allow the Town to monitor demand in this part of the system.

The total estimated cost for these improvements is \$492,300 as shown in Table 2 below:

C. Chadwick Lake Filter Plant Roof Replacement

The age of the existing roof on the Chadwick Lake Filter Plant is unknown. However, recent leaks into the pump room have prompted an inspection of the condition of the roof. Based on the inspection, it is recommended that the existing membrane roof be removed and replaced with a new membrane roof.

The cost estimate for this work is \$230,000 including engineering, legal and administrative costs.

D. Water System Meter Replacement Program

In the past few years, the Town of Newburgh has begun the process of upgrading its customers' meters. The Town has selected a radio read head to be installed on compatible Badger meters and replacement of non-compatible meters with new Badger meters with radio read heads. The goal is to modernize its meter reading operations, reducing labor costs of meter reading, improving the accuracy of its meter reads and improving the revenue stream of both the TONCWD and associated Sewer Districts.

To date, approximately 1200 of the Town's 6600 accounts have been upgraded to the new meter reading technology. However, recognizing that a complete retrofit of its customers' meters would take 5 years or more, and recognizing that a significant number of its customer meters are 25 to 40 years old and well past their projected useful life, the Town of Newburgh has elected to fund the replacement of the remaining 5400 meters and hire a specialized contractor to undertake the installation of the new meters and heads.

The estimated cost of this project is \$1,500,000.

III. SUMMARY OF PROJECT COSTS

For the four projects discussed above, the combined project costs are as follows:

IV. PROJECT FINANCING

The Town intends to use some existing available monies and bonding to pay for the improvements identified in this Report. A breakdown of monies available for use for these projects consist of the following:

Stewart Airport WST Capital Project	\$ 850,000
Capital Reserve Fund	400,000
Total Available Funds:	\$1,250,000

The total project cost of \$4,230,300 minus the currently available funds of \$1,250,000 leaves an amount of \$2,980,300 to be bonded.

The calculated principal and interest payment for a 20 year bond at an interest rate of 2.5 percent is \$223,525.

Payment of the principal and interest payment can be made either from the TONCWD's Water 1 and Water 2 charges which are based on the Assessed Value of the individual properties in the Water District, or because of the inclusion of the meter replacement program, payment could be made utilizing an increase in the water usage rates. Each of these methods is discussed below.

Water 1 and Water 2 Repayment

Utilizing Water 1 and Water 2 charges for repayment of the principal and interest would result in an increase in these charges of \$0.14 / 1000 AV as shown below:

\$223,525 / (924,685.866 + 703,935.849) = \$0.14 / 1000 AV

For an average district property (single family home with an AV of \$85,000), the net increase in their W1/W2 bill would be approximately twenty four (24) dollars.

Water Usage Repayment

Utilizing water usage rates for repayment of the principal and interest would result in an increase in the water rates of approximately \$0.35 per thousand gallons as shown below:

\$223,525 / 640,000,000 = \$0.35 per thousand gallons

For an average water user (75,000 gallons usage per year), their quarterly bill would increase by \$6.40 for a total annual increase of \$25.60.

This is slightly higher than using W1/W2 charges because the subset of district properties connected to the water distribution system is smaller than all the properties in the district. However, given that approximately 50 percent of the bond is being used for new water meter technology used by water consumers, this method only impacts district properties receiving a direct benefit.

We have completed our investigation and appraisal of your property damage claim.

As we previously discussed, Travelers policies pay Actual Cash Value (ACV) for property damage. Fees, Costs, and Access to Workpapers

Our fees for the audit and accounting services described above are based upon the value of the services performed and the time required by the individuals essigned to the engagement, plus direct expenses. We propose that our fee for this audit engagement will be \$28,400 for the year ending December 31, 2013. Our fee estimate and completion of our work is based upon the following-erneria:

If any of the aforementioned criteria are not met, then fees may increase. Interim billings will be submitted as work

progresses and as expenses are incurred. Billings are due upon submission.

It is agreed by the Town of Newburgh and Vanacore, DeBenedictus, DiGovanni & Weddell, LLP that, should you hire any of our professionals assigned to this project within eighteen months of this assignment, you will be billed 100 percent of their current annual salary. This additional fee is being charged to offse recruitment, training and development expenses we would incur to replace this person. In addition, our professional standards require that we perform certain additional procedures, on current and previous years' engagements, whenever a partner or professional employee leaves the firm and is subsequently employed by, or associated with, a client in a key position.

Claim Resolution

Town of Newburgh and Vanacore, DeBenedictus, DiGovanni and Weddell, LLP agree that no claim arising out of services rendered pursuant to this agreement shall be filed more than two years after the date of the audit report issued by Vanacore, DeBenedictus, DiGovanni and Weddell, LLP or the date of this arrangement letter if no report has been issued. Town of Newburgh waives any claim for punitive damages. Vanacore, DeBenedictus, DiGovanni and Weddell, LLP's liability for all claims, damages and costs of Town of Newburgh arising from this engagement is limited to the amount of fees paid by Town of Newburgh to Vanacore, DeBenedictus, DiGovanni and Weddell, LLP for the services rendered under this arrangement letter.

If any dispute arises among the parties hereto, the parties agree first to try in good faith to settle the dispute by mediation administered by the American Arbitration Association under its Rules for Professional Accounting and Related Services Disputes before resorting to litigation. The costs of any mediation proceeding shall be shared equally by all parties.

Reporting

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We will issue a written report upon completion of our audit of Town of Newburgh's financial statements. Our report will be addressed to the Town Board of Town of Newburgh. We cannot provide assurance that an unmodified opinion will be expressed. Circumstances may arise in which it is necessary for us to modify our opinion, add an emphasis-of-matter or other-matter paragraph(s), or withdraw from the engagement.

Our report on internal control will include any significant deficiencies and material weaknesses in controls of which we become aware as a result of obtaining an understanding of internal control consistent with requirements of the standards identified above. Our report on compliance will address material errors, fraud and abuse of which we become aware, consistent with requirements of the standards identified above.

This letter constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of agreement between Vanacore, DeBenedictus, DiGovanni and Weddell, LLP and Town of Newburgh, superseding all proposals, oral or written, and all other communications, with respect to the terms of the engagement between the parties.

Purpose

This proposal is offered to the **Town of Newburgh** in order to make Employee Assistance Program services available to its employees. Comprehensive assessment and referral support and services will be provided in relation to non-medical personal and family problems that may adversely affect work performance and employee welfare. **Corporate Services EAP** proposes to provide these services as described herein to the satisfaction of Town of Newburgh and its employees.

Our proposed approach encompasses two sets of activities:

- Working with Town of Newburgh managers and supervisors to enhance their ability, as supervisors, to identify employees who may be dealing with personal problems themselves, or within their families, and appropriately approach such employees regarding intervention; and
- Providing and arranging assessment and referral services with follow-up on a confidential basis for employees who are referred to the EA Program or voluntarily seek assistance. The objective in these instances is to enhance the performance, welfare and retention of all valuable employees of the Town of Newburgh.

Proposed Services

Organizational Assessment, Training and Ongoing Follow-up and Support

1. Corporate Services EAP will conduct a needs assessment in collaboration with Town of Newburgh managers and supervisors in order to identify specific internal concerns related to this EA Program and ensure that they are addressed during program implementation.

2. Corporate Services EAP will provide initial, in-person, organizational and supervisory orientation sessions in collaboration with management and will distribute informational brochures and contact information for each employee.

3. Corporate Services EAP, in collaboration with Town of Newburgh management, will analyze organizational and supervisory training needs that are to be addressed through ongoing leadership training. Two (2) relevant leadership training sessions will then be established and delivered in-person on a semi-annual basis by Corporate Services EAP. Additional leadership training sessions can be added on an incremental fee basis either on an annual, pre-planned basis or on an as-needed basis. A list of possible workshop topics is enclosed.

4. Corporate Services EAP will provide utilization reports on a quarterly basis, showing program utilization rates and data on utilization by problem type, referral source, and demographic grouping, while maintaining employee confidentiality.

Employee Services

- 1. Employees and members of their immediate household with personal or family problems will be provided the following:
 - Professional assessment and referral services by clinicians licensed in their field of practice. Typically up to three sessions are provided at no cost to the employee/client at a professional site convenient to the employee's residence or place of work, as requested by the employee. All assessment, counseling and referral will be conducted face-to-face between the employee and the clinician.

- An employee's initial appointment with a clinician will typically be scheduled by Corporate Services EAP within three business days of the employee's request unless it is an emergency, in which case the appointment will be scheduled within 24 hours.
- 2. Affiliate clinicians will make every effort to refer clients needing extended treatment to professionals covered by the employee's insurance, whenever possible.
- 3. Corporate Services EAP utilizes a network of 150 licensed affiliates and selects those best suited to each employee's specific needs. These affiliates have been selected and proven in fulfilling EA program needs for Corporate Services EAP throughout the Hudson Valley for more than 25 years.
- 4. On-call emergency assistance will be accessible 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, including holidays.
- 5. Corporate Services EAP is available and responsive in times of an organizational crisis during which we will make every effort to provide services appropriate and responsive for the crisis situation.

Fees

Corporate Services EAP proposes to provide EAP services for Town of Newburgh and its 220 full and part time employees at an annual fee of \$5,390.00. This fee will be in effect for 12 months and, if agreeable to both parties, extended with any adjustments in fee based on changes in the number of employees to be covered or changes in services to be provided for subsequent periods. EAP services provided under this Agreement are non-denominational in nature; funds provided to Corporate Services under this Agreement are not used for any religious purposes.

General

Corporate Services EAP sees successful introduction, participation and continuation of this Employee Assistance Program as an essential endeavor that is incumbent on Corporate Services EAP to effectively provide and maintain in collaboration and cooperation with Town of Newburgh, whose involvement is also necessary for this program's success.

Corporate Services EAP has been serving the Hudson Valley and the surrounding areas for more than 25 years. Our parent organization, Catholic Charities Community Services of Orange County, is committed in numerous ways to the region's communities as evidenced by our ongoing work with and support for all: children; families; employees; employers; schools; mental health providers; social service agencies; health care providers; government agencies and housing providers.
