On 9 August 2017, I met with Dave Chiusano, NYSDEC to review the design effort and cost implications of adding water main extensions on Rock Cut Road and Little Britain Road. He stated that NYSDEC was fully willing to incur these costs to provide service to properties adversely impacted by PFOS contamination from the Stewart Airport site.

Attached you will find a schematic plan for each of these water main extensions and a preliminary cost estimate for all four water main extensions.

Based on the above, I am asking for Town Board authorization to begin the surveying work and to request an updated engineering proposal.

As you are aware I am in the process of evaluating and looking into a new accounting program due to the fact that our current system (KVS) is slowly being phased out, no longer being updated, and as our current mainframe which supports the program is not being supported anymore by Microsoft.

In that regard I contacted three vendors which seem to be the leaders in this area for municipal accounting software: Logics, Edmunds, and New World. The accounting department and I went to their respective demonstrations as well as to their municipal clients to see how it works in the field. I acquired their quotes which I have summarized and have attached as Exhibit A, to this memo for your review.

After an extensive analysis I think that the New World system would be most advantageous for the Town to acquire for the following reasons:

- Their extensive local client list, which I have attached as Exhibit B. (Town of New Windsor just went with them this month)
- Perpetual upgrades, as they are developed, with no additional licensing fees
- Department Heads will have a access to their specific departments accounting information for better decision making and analysis
- The ability to add-on to their extensive list of modules such as: Utility billing, Parks and Recreation software, Meeting minutes, Code Compliance, and cloud access for employees and vendors, to name a few

Although the two other companies are very good companies as well, my fear is that they are regional companies and we may be in the same situation we are in now say five to ten years from now; being forced into picking a new system and going through the pains of transition.

I recommend that the Town Board approve the purchase of the New World System at a cost of \$126,122.00, which will be paid out as follows: \$10,890.00 this year and \$115,232.00 in 2018.

We currently have \$75,000 in a Capital Project and I am recommending for the 2018 budget an interfund transfer from the following funds: \$28,600 from General Fund, \$7,800 from Highway Fund, \$10,400 from Water Fund and \$5,200 from the Sewer Funds.

After the initial purchase the annual maintenance fees starting in 2019 will be absorbed by the accounting department which will amount to roughly \$10,000 per year.

WHEREAS, Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corp. ("Central Hudson") has increased rates for electric delivery services and for natural gas delivery services; and

WHEREAS, the Public Service Commission adopted a plan which provided Central

Hudson the following rate increases beginning July 1, 2015.

- In 2015, electric rates increased \$2.3 million, up 0.3 percent or \$0.38 a month on the total bill for the average residential customer, while gas rates dropped \$721,000, or -0.3 percent or \$0.33 a month for the average residential customer.
- In 2016, electric rates increased \$17 million, up 3.4 percent or \$3.86 a month for the average residential customer, while gas rates increased \$5.4 million, or 1 percent or \$1.19 a month for the average residential customer.
- iii. In 2017, electric rates increase \$24.1 million, up 4.8 percent or \$5.58 month for the average residential customer, while gas rates were to increase will increase \$6 million, or 4.3 percent or \$4.96 a month for the average residential customer.
- ; and

WHEREAS, Central Hudson has now filed a plan with the New York State Public Service Commission to further increase rates during the term of July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019.which would raise total average residential electricity bills by about \$4.19 per month, or a 3.7% increase and an increase in average residential natural gas heating bills by \$5.54 per month, or a 4.7 percent increase; and

WHEREAS, if the 2018 rate increases are approved, it will mean Central Hudson's electric rates have been permitted by the Public Service Commission to be increased 11.9% during the period July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2019 and gas rates by 10% over the 2015 rates, increases far exceeding the increases in both income and other costs of living most of our residents have experienced, other than the health insurance and healthcare cost increases which have greatly impacted most residents lives; and

WHEREAS, Central Hudson claims that the proposed electric rate increase is

predominantly related to distribution and transmission line clearance; growth of capital

investment in electrical infrastructure; an increase in the return on equity and a higher equity ratio compared to the prior rate plan; transmission and distribution repair work; information technology expense; and an increase in low-income bill discounts and on the gas side of the business, they are the product of accelerated replacement of leak prone pipe; increased labor expense; increased information technology expense; an increase in the low-income bill discounts; and an increase in the return on equity and a "higher equity ratio" in the business,

; and

WHEREAS, Fortis, the parent of Central Hudson, paid dividends in 2016 higher in amount than in each of the previous four years; and

WHEREAS, customers in a typical home are experiencing increases in their electric and natural gas bills at a time when many are continuing to experience extraordinary financial hardships; and

WHEREAS, Central Hudson's area of service includes the Town of Newburgh and the rate increases will cause unnecessary hardship for numerous residents of the Town, particularly those with fixed or limited incomes, as well as placing an additional financial burden on the Town's taxpayers as the Town's own facilities are served by Central Hudson and discouraging economic development; and

WHEREAS, the proposed rate increases will additionally place further economic strains on small businesses and employers in the Town of Newburgh; and

WHEREAS, upon consideration, the Town Board finds that such rate increases place an undue financial burden on residents, businesses and local governments, including the Town of Newburgh, and discourage further industrial and commercial development in our region.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Newburgh in its capacity as governing body of the Town, does hereby oppose the rate increases for supply of electricity and natural gas which Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corp. has charged;

and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that certified copies of this Resolution be delivered to the Hon. Kathleen H. Burgess, Secretary, New York State Public Service Commission, Empire State Plaza, Agency Building 3, Albany, New York 12223-1350, the Hon. William J. Larkin, Jr., Senator for the 39TH District, and the Hon. Frank Skartados, Assemblyman for the 104TH District, by the Town Clerk and to the chief executives of surrounding municipalities served by Central Hudson; and

BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED, that the aforesaid resolutions shall take effect immediately.
