E-ZPass On-the-Go Retail Sales Program Application

E-ZPASS ON-THE-GO RETAIL SALES AGREEMENT

(To be executed after applicant is approved as an E-ZPass On-the-Go Merchant)

This AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Agreement") is made this *[insert day of month]* day of *[insert month and year]*, by and between the New York State Thruway Authority (hereinafter "Authority"), a public corporation organized and existing pursuant to Article 2, Title 9 of the New York State Public Authorities Law, as amended, whose principal office is located at 200 Southern Boulevard, Albany, New York 12209 (Mailing Address: P.O. Box 189, Albany, New York 12201-0189), and *[insert name of Vendor]* (hereinafter "Merchant"), a *[insert organizational form - e.g., corporation, partnership, LLC, LLP, etc.]* duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of *[insert state]*, having its principal office at *[insert address]*.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Authority Is statutorily responsible for financing, constructing, reconstructing, improving, developing, maintaining and operating a 570-mile superhighway system known as the Thruway; and

WHEREAS, as part of such authorization, the Authority is empowered to collect tolls and fees to maintain the operations and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of these responsibilities, the Authority implemented an electronic toll collection ("ETC") system known as E-ZPass; and

WHEREAS, E-ZPass is a program whereby a customer pre-pays funds, receive a transponder (Tag) which is then mounted in or on the customer's vehicle, and as the vehicle passes mough a toll plaza, an antenna in the lane "reads" that Tag's computerized information and the appropriate toll is deducted from the prepaid funds; and

WHEREAS, because E-ZPass expedites transactions of the toll plaza thereby reducing congestion, the Authority wishes to expand the use of E-ZPass to as many Authority patrons as possible through the retail sale of E-ZPass Tags, a program known as E-ZPass On-the-Go has been established;

WHEREAS, E-ZPass On-the-Go allows a marchant to sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags for 2-axle, 4-tire passenger vehicles that are for private use; and

WHEREAS, Merchant wishes to participate in the E-ZPass On-the-Go program subject to all of the terms and conditions of such program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, for the consideration hereinafter named, do agree as follows:

I. CORROBATE WARRANTIES AND CONDUCT

Section 1.1 - Application Warranties and Changes

A. Merchant represents and warrants that: (I) all of the information provided and statements made in the Application, which is attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement, are complete, true and accurate; and (ii) the business identified on the Application as Merchant is owned in the manner set forth in the Application and that such business is the proprietor of the location(s) at which E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags will be sold.

B. Merchant shall notify the Authority of any changes to any information Merchant supplied on its Application, Including any changes in the ownership of such business and the retail locations at which Merchant wishes to sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags, within seven (7) calendar days of such change. Merchant shall notify the Authority at least thirty (30) days prior to ceasing business operations, either temporarily or permanently.

Section 1.2 - Observance of Laws

Merchant agrees to observe and obey all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, and policies, and to procure all necessary licenses and permits.

Section 1.3 - Non-Assignment

This Agreement may not be assigned by Merchant nor may its right, title or interest therein be assigned, transferred, conveyed, subcontracted, sublet or otherwise disposed of without the previous consent, in writing, of the Authority and any attempts to assign this Agreement without the Authority's written consent are null and vold.

Section 1.4 - Independent Contractor

Merchant is and shall be, in all respects, an independent contractor when participating in the E-ZPass Onthe-Go program. In accordance with its status as an independent contractor, Merchant covenants and agrees that neither it nor its agents and/or employees will hold itself or themselves out as or claim to be an officer or employee of the Authority, and that neither Merchant nor its agents and/or employees shall make any claim, demand or application to or for any right or privilege applicable to an officer or employee of the Authority, including, but not limited to Worker's Compensation coverage, Unemployment Insurance benefits, Social Security coverage or Retirement System membership or credit.

II. RETAIL TAG SALES

Section 2.1 - Non-Exclusivity

This Agreement shall in no way be deemed to give Merchant the exclusive right to sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags. Merchant acknowledges that the Authority has made no representations with respect to any territorial or geographic exclusivity and that the Authority has the right to utilize other merchants to sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags.

Section 2.2 – Sales Locations

A. Merchant may sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags only at the retail locations listed on its Application when have been approved by the Authority. Such retail locations must be physically situated in the New York State counties listed below:

B. Merchant shall not sell by ZPass On-the-Go Tags at retail locations that are physically situated outside New York State or in the New York State counties listed below.

C. Merchant shall not sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags on the Internet, door-to-door or by mailorder. Merchant may not re-sell or otherwise transfer E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags to another business entity.

Section 2.3 - Sales Offerings

A. Merchant must make E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags available for sale to its customers during all days and hours that Merchant's retail locations are open for business. Merchant shall display and sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags on a first in, first out (FIFO) basis; that is, Merchant shall sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags in the date order in which they were received into stock. Merchant shall treat all E-ZPass On-the-Go customers with courtesy and in a manner which is equal to or better than the manner in which Merchant treats its customers in general.

B. Merchant may sell each E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag for an amount Merchant deems appropriate, provided that Merchant shall not sell an E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag for more than \$25.00. The sale of E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags is not subject to sales tax and compensating use tax and Merchant shall not charge or collect such taxes on such sales.

C. Merchant may only sell E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags to customers with 2-axle, 4-tire passenger vehicles that are for private use.

D. Merchant shall not refund to any customer the cost of an E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag once it has been purchased by such customer.

Section 2.4 – Risk of Loss

Risk of loss for all E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags delivered to Merchant passes to Merchant when Merchant takes delivery of Tags. Merchant understands that E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags are pre-valued and must be safeguarded in the same manner that Merchant would safeguard cash. Merchant acknowledges and agrees that If E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags in Merchant's possession are lost, stolen, tampered with, mutilated or destroyed: (i) Merchant is liable in full to the Authority for the value of such Tags; and (ii) the Authority shall not have any obligation to refund to Merchant any amounts relating to such Tags.

Section 2.5 - Marketing

A. Merchant shall prominently display at its retail locations where E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags are sold such E-ZPass On-the-Go signage and promotional materials as may be provided by the Authority. Merchant shall not include the Authority, E-ZPass or E-ZPass On-the-Go names or logos in its own signage, advertising or promotional materials unless such materials have been approved, in advance of usage, by the Authority.

B. Merchant hereby authorizes the Authority to include Merchant's name, likeness, and business name, and address in the Authority's advertising and promotions for the E-ZPass On-the-Go program.

C. From time to time, the Authority may require Merchant to advertise special Expass On-the-Go promotions. The commercial terms of such special promotions as between the Authority and Merchant and as between Merchant and customer shall be as set forth in a separate transmittation the Authority to Merchant.

Section 2.6 - Site Inspections

The Authority shall have the right to conduct site inspections at any of Merchant's retail locations where E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags are sold. At the direction of the Authority, Merchant shall revise signage and promotional materials that have been provided by the other in.

Section 2.7 - Confidentiality

A. Merchant shall safeguard personal information about its E-ZPass On-the-Go customers to the maximum extent permitted by law.

B. Merchant shall not sell, distribute or make available in any way the names and addresses of E-ZPass On-the-Go customers to any antiby that will use such information for any commercial purpose; provided, however, that in the event is costomer utilizes a check or credit card to purchase E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags at one of Merchant's retail locations, the foregoing restriction shall not be deemed to preclude Merchant from exchanging such information with the applicable banking or credit card institution for the purpose of effectuating such purchase.

III. MÉRCHANT E-ZPASS ON-THE-GO TAG ORDERS, PURCHASES DELIVERIES, PAYMENTS AND RETURNS

Section 3.1 - E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag Orders

To initiate participation in the program, Merchant must order a minimum of 25 E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags for sale at approved retail locations. E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag orders will be shipped to the approved retail location(s) specified by Merchant when placing the order.

Re-stocking orders for E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags must be in multiples of 25 Tags. Re-stocking orders will also be shipped to the approved retail location(s) specified by Merchant at the time of the re-stocking order.

Section 3.2 – Purchases and Payments

A. Merchant must pay \$21.00 for each E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag ordered. There will be no additional charge for the shipping of E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags to Merchant.

B. Merchant must make payment for each E-ZPass On-the-Go Tag order within forty-five (45) days of receipt of an invoice for such order.

C. The Authority will provide Merchant with a credit or refund for all E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags that are damaged during delivery and are received by Merchant in a damaged condition provided Merchant notifies the Authority within five (5) days of receipt of such damaged Tags.

IV. TERM AND TERMINATION

Section 4.1 - Term

This Agreement shall commence upon the Authority's acceptance of Merchant's Application and the execution of this Agreement by both parties. This Agreement shall continue in existence until terminated by either party.

Section 4.2 – Termination of Retall Location Participation in Program

The Authority shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to disapprove and terminate the participation of any of Merchant's retail locations in the E-ZPass On-the-Go program, and such action shall in no event be deemed a breach of contract. In the event the Authority exercises that right Merchant shall immediately return to the Authority all E-ZPass On-the-Go Tags that Merchant has in its possession at those retail locations. The Authority will refund to Merchant \$21.00 for each such Tag returned provided the Tag packaging is unopened and in good condition with no physical wear and tear, and there has been no transaction activity on the Tag.

Section 4.3 - Suspension, Abandonment and Termination

A. The Authority shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to postpone, suspend, abandon or terminate this Agreement at any time and for any reason, and such action shall in no event be deemed a breach of contract. This includes the Authority's right to terminate this Agreement at any time in the event the Authority finds that Merchant is non-responsible or has failed to accurately discose vendor responsibility information. In the event the Authority exercises its right to postpone, suspend, abandon or terminate this Agreement, Merchant shall immediately return to the Authority all E-Zhas On-the-Go Tags that Merchant has in its possession. The Authority will refund to Merchant \$21.00 for each such Tag returned provided the Tag packaging is unopened and in good condition with no physical wear and tear, and there has been no transaction activity on the Tag. no transaction activity on the Tag.



V. MISCELLANEOUS

Merchant agrees that it shall not make any charges or claims for damages against the Authority for any delays or hindrances from any cause whatsoever during the progress of any portion of the E-ZPass On- the-Go program.

At the location identified on the Application, as may be updated or amended by Merchant. Merchant:

Section 5.3 - Liability

Merchant shall be responsible for all damage to life and property due to negligent or otherwise tortious acts, errors or omissions of Merchant in connection with its participation in the E-ZPass On-the-Go program. Further, it is expressly understood that Merchant shall indemnify and save harmless the Authority and/or the State of New York, as their interests may appear, from claims, suits, actions, damages, and costs of every name and description resulting from the negligence of Merchant, and such indemnity shall not be limited by reasons of any insurance coverage. However, Merchant shall not be required to indemnify the Authority for that portion of any claim, suit, action, damage or cost which arises due to the negligent act or omission of the Authority and shall not be required to indemnify the State of New York for that portion of any claim, suit, action, damage or cost which arises due to the negligent act or omission of the State. The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

Section 5.4 - Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York except supremacy clause requires otherwise.

Section 5.5 - No Waiver of Provisions



The Authority's failure to exercise or delay in exercising any right or remedy under this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of such right or remedy or any other right or remedy or forth therein. 2) We will give you a link to the web app and would suggest you putting it on your Town of Newburgh website on the Town Clerk's department page. Residents will click the link and it will go to the search screen.

ORDER CALLING PUBLIC HEARING IN THE MATTER OF THE INCREASE AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE FACILITIES OF THE CROSSROADS CONSOLIDATED SEWER DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF NEWBURGH, ORANGE COUNTY, NEW YORK

Following the procedures of Town Law Section 202-b which included a public hearing, the Town Board in 2014 determined the Meadow Hill South Parallel Relief Sewer project to be in the public interest at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,160,000. As you may recall, the project is being undertaken at the instance of the NYS DEC and following the project's approval, certain investigations were performed and alternatives explored to address the issues of concern with the sewer system. The estimated costs for the project have now increased by \$204,000 to \$1,364,000 and a supplemental Town Law Section 202-b proceeding is required in order to authorize the additional funding. Also enclosed in Addendum No. 1 to the original Engineering Report addressing the cost increase prepared by the project engineers, GHD.

MEADOW HILL SOUTH PARALLEL RELIEF SEWER PROJECT PAGE 2

As the Board is aware, the Meadow Hill South Sewer District was part of the sewer district consolidation undertaken in 2016. Under the terms of the approved Joint Consolidation Agreement, the additional \$206,000 in costs will be borne by the whole Crossroads Consolidated Sewer District, while the original \$1,160,000 will still be borne by the property owners in the benefit area of the consolidated district that was formerly the Meadow Hill South Sewer District.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this addendum is to reflect changes to the original March 2014 Engineering Report as a result of the following work:

- 1. Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Survey (SSES) and flow monitoring.
- 2. Sanitary sewer rehabilitation work.
- 3. Post-construction flow monitoring.
- 4. Smoke testing and additional flow monitoring.
- 5. An updated capacity re-evaluation.

A summary of each of these work items follows.

SSES and Flow Monitoring (Spring 2015)

As a result of comments from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), the Town of Newburgh proceeded with an SSES to identify locations that could potentially be contributing additional flow to the sanitary sewer system. As part of the SSES effort, flow monitoring was conducted within five sub-basins within the Meadow Hill South (MHS) wastewater collection system. Approximately \$530,000 of sewer rehabilitation, including both open-cut and trenchless repairs, was identified.

Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Work (Spring 2017)

As a result of the SSES, the Town of Newburgh developed contract documents for sanitary sewer rehabilitation. The contract was awarded in the amount of \$239,150 for sewer rehabilitation work. This work was completed by August 2017.

Post-Construction Flow Monitoring (Spring 2018)

Post-construction flow monitoring was conducted in the spring of 2018, and a report was submitted to NYSDEC in August 2018. The post-construction flow monitoring work concluded that rehabilitation efforts had been successful in reducing I/I within MHS; however, additional work would be required to eliminate other potential sources of I/I. The additional work included smoke testing in the highest flow sub-basins and the collection of additional flow monitoring data within the highest flow sub-basins.

Smoke Testing and Additional Flow Monitoring (Spring 2019 - Ongoing)

In spring 2019, smoke testing was completed in the two highest flow sub-basins (Basins 5 and 1). The smoke testing did not identify any public direct connections or unauthorized private direct connections. At the time of this addendum, additional flow monitoring is still ongoing.



Updated Capacity Re-evaluation (Spring 2019)

As a result of the flow reductions observed during the post-construction flow monitoring, the original engineering design outlined in the 2014 report was re-evaluated. It was determined that a reduction to the 8-inch parallel relief sewer (assuming split flow at Union Avenue) would be acceptable to reduce overflows within the MHS sewer basin. As part of this effort, a new cost estimate was generated, with costs inflated to 2019 dollars.

The details of the re-evaluation are included in Attachment No. 1 to this addendum.

Based on the work completed above, the direct changes to this report are detailed below.

Item No. 1:

1. Introduction

This technical memorandum presents the methodology, variables, and results of the re-evaluation of the capacity of the proposed parallel relief sewer for the Meadow Hill South (MHS) sewer area. This capacity re-evaluation uses the post construction flow data collected during the spring 2018 post-construction flow monitoring period and was performed using the same model and methods as the 2014 hydraulic evaluation.

This capacity re-evaluation is part of the Town's continued efforts to reduce the sanitary sewer overflows within the MHS Sewer Area. The previous, pre-construction, hydraulic evaluation concluded that a 10-inch parallel relief sewer would be required to convey wet weather flows from MHS to a junction on Union Avenue where flow would be split north through a 6-inch pressure sewer and south through a 10-inch pressure sewer. Currently, flow is only directed north through the 6-inch pressure sewer as the valve on the 10-inch pressure sewer is jammed closed. As an additional aspect of this evaluation, the Town indicated that flow exclusively through the 10-inch pressure sewer at Union Avenue should be evaluated.

2. Hydraulic Model Re-Evaluation

The hydraulic model that was developed in 2014 was used to re-evaluate the hydraulic capacity for a variety of different diameter parallel relief sewers to convey the flow from MHS to Union Avenue. Table 2.1 shows the three flow values that were used as the basis for this analysis.

(3) 4-inches of rainfall over a 6-hour period. Occurrence rate provided by precip.eas.comell.edu







Each of these design flows were selected for the following reasons. The first flow, 0.3 MGD, was selected as this is the average dry weather flow for the Meadow Hill South (MHS) system. This allows for the assessment of the potential systems ability to convey typical daily flows. The second design flow, 1.3 MGD, was the highest peak hourly flow (PHF) observed during the spring 2018 flow monitoring period. This event represents a 1-year frequency storm event and allows for the assessment of the system's ability to handle a typical rainfall event. Finally, 1.8 MGD was selected as the third design flow. This flow was estimated to be the 25-year frequency storm event based on the flow monitoring data collected in spring of 2018. This event represents a large storm event such as a tropical storm or hurricane. Higher flow beyond the 25-year storm was not considered.

Based on the design flows, the following potential design alternatives were selected:

- 8-inch diameter parallel relief Sewer with existing 6-inch sewer
- 10-inch diameter parallel relief Sewer with existing 6-inch sewer
- New 8-Inch sewer and abandonment of existing 6-inch sewer
- New 10-inch sewer and abandonment of existing 6-inch sewer
- New 12-inch sewer and abandonment of existing 6-inch sewer
- New 10-inch sewer up to the low point under the Thruway, 8-inch sewer from the low point to Union Avenue, and abandonment of existing 6-inch sewer

Using the three design flows and six potential design alternatives presented above, three main design criteria were assessed. The first design criteria assessed was the potential system's ability to convey flow from MHS to the junction point on Union Avenue. The largest driver of this criteria was how the design responded to the 1-year and 25-year storm events. The second design criteria was the lowest velocity within the potential system between the Communitor Building and the junction with Union Avenue. Recommended Standards for Wastewater Facilities, 2014, recommends a minimum velocity when flowing full of at least 3 feet per second (fps) during average flow. This criteria was the largest driver during average dry weather flows, as velocities during these times would be lowest. The final design criteria considered during this analysis was splitting the flow at the junction with Union Avenue. Both split flow, between the 6-inch heading north and the 10-inch heading south, as well as, flow exclusively down the 10-inch was modeled. For design alternatives that include parallel relief, the parallel relief sewer was only active for flows exceeding 0.45 MGD; for flows below 0.45 MGD, only the existing 6-inch sewer was used. It is important to note that for the purpose of this analysis, it was assumed that conditions were similar to those during the spring 2018 flow monitoring period. These conditions included a high ground water table.

3. Findings and Conclusions

The hydraulic model was run to determine the outcomes for each of the potential designs detailed above. The results of this analysis are presented in appendix A. Hydraulic grade lines graphs for each potential design during the 1.8 MGD event are presented in appendix B. During this analysis, three overflow events were observed. First being for the 8-inch parallel relief sewer and existing 6-inch sewer during the 25-year storm event, the second being a new 8-inch sewer during the 25-year storm event, and the third being the



new 10-inch to 8-inch during the 25-year storm event. Both of these overflows happened while flow was not split at Union Avenue. During average dry weather flows, the new 8-inch, 10-inch, 10-inch to 8-inch, and 12-inch design alternatives, including abandonment of the existing 6-inch sewer, had velocities well below the 3 fps design criteria (1.3 fps, 1.3 fps, 0.9 fps, and 0.6 fps respectively). Based on the results presented in appendix A, below are the following design alternative recommendations:

Non-Split Flow at Union Avenue:

10-inch diameter parallel relief sewer and existing 6-inch sewer

Split Flow at Union Avenue:

8-inch diameter parallel relief sewer and existing 6-inch sewer

For non-split flow at Union Avenue, it would be recommended for the Town to proceed with the original proposed design of a 10-inch diameter parallel relief sewer. Previously, this proposed design was recommended with split flow at Union Avenue, however due to the flow reductions from the inflow and infiltration reduction projects, split flow would no longer be needed. If the Town wished to split flow at Union Avenue, than the proposed parallel relief sewer could be downsized to an 8-inch diameter. It is not recommended that the existing 6-inch sewer be replaced with an 8-inch, 10-inch, 10-inch to 8-inch, or 12-inch sewer, as during normal dry weather flows, velocities would be well below 3 fps, resulting in potential maintenance issues.

Regardless of which alternative is selected for construction, the following will apply. First, the existing valve located on the 10-inch pipe that runs south along Union Avenue will have to be repaired or replaced. Second, the Town has expressed a desire to limit the acquisition of larger easements, as such; the proposed design will be constructed within the current easement where physically possible. Finally, it is recommended that maintenance is performed after each storm event that results in the use of the parallel relief sewer. As designed in 2014, the proposed parallel relief sewer includes two cleanout locations, located on either side of I-87, which would allow Town staff to flush the low point of the parallel relief sewer.
