

County Reply – Mandatory Review of Local Planning Action as per NYS General Municipal Law §239-1, m, &n

Comments:

The Planning Department has reviewed the submitted materials regarding the appeal for a use variance and has found no evidence that intermunicipal or countywide impacts would result from its approval. County Planning recommends that the Board act on this variance request only if the applicant satisfies the <u>unnecessary hardship standard</u>, as defined by New York State law.

The courts of New York hold that the <u>unnecessary hardship standard</u> is satisfied by competent proof of each of the following:

1. the land in question cannot yield a reasonable return, in dollars and cents, if used for any use permitted in the zone,

2. the use to be authorized by the variance will not alter the essential character of the locality,

3. the hardship is unique to the parcel and not general throughout the zoning district, and

4. the hardship is not self-created.

Although it is for the Town Zoning Board of Appeals to determine whether the unnecessary hardship standard is met in this case, we note the presence onsite of contaminated soil and potentially contaminated water resources, which would greatly limit the development of this property for residential uses as permitted in the R-1 zone by Chapter 185 of the Town of Newburgh Code.
