I write to you on behalf of and at the direction of the Town of Newburgh Planning Board. The above referenced applicant appeared before the planning board during its meeting of March 5, 2015. The applicant proposes to construct an addition on motel premises to be used for motel supply related storage. In order to accomplish this objective, the following variances are required:

- A variance from the rear yard setback requirement. Sixty feet is required and only 43 feet is provided;
- A variance from the side yard setback requirement. Fifty feet is required and 2.7 feet is provided;
- A variance from the combined side yard setback requirement. One hundred feet is required and 29 feet is provided;
- A variance from the lot width requirement. Two hundred feet is required and only 125 feet is provided;
- A variance from the lot area requirement. Five acres are required and

only 1.2 acres is provided;

A variance from the sign setback requirement of 15 feet.

This matter is a Type II action (under 4,000 square-feet) before both boards.


